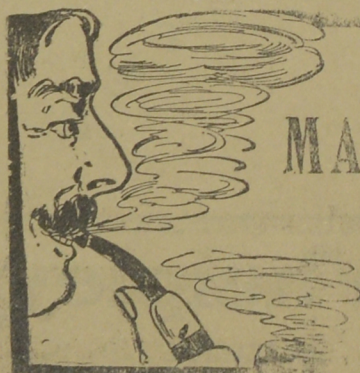

 QUEBEC CLUB

World's Champions Interviewed Last Night by Riley Herr, Dr. Cousineau and Cattarnich

Quebec, Q., Sept. 28—The holders of the world's championship in hockey seem to have at last come into their own. Now it seems to be a question of knocking at Quebec's door instead of Quebec pleading at the door of the existing or other proposed league. That the proposal for a new professional league is really serious was evidenced last evening when Dr. Cousineau of the Nationals, Riley Herr, who has been credited as being one of promoters of the new league, and Cattarnich of the Nationals, met several of the directors at the Chateau Frontenac. The Quebec Club was represented by its president, Senator Choquette, M. J. Quinn, manager, and B. J. Kaine, secretary, and they listened with interest to the views presented by the visitors. The local club representatives expressed no opinion upon the situation. They can take no decision upon the matter until the annual meeting which is to be held shortly.

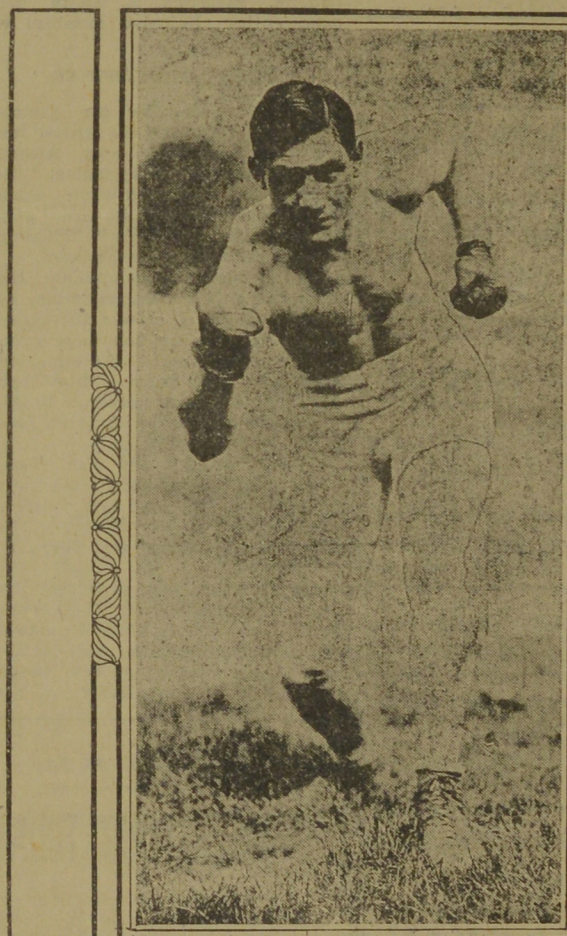
### IMPROVEMENT IN TROTTERS OF MARITIME PROVINCES

(Acadian Recorder)

The improvement in the trotters in the Maritime Provinces is aptly illustrated by the recent meeting at the Halifax Exhibition. It is 21 years ago this October when Israel, owned by A. C. Bell, New Glasgow, won the free-for-all from Gladstone, Olive and Lucy Derrick in 2:34 1/2, 2:34, 2:28. In the last heat Meehan drove Israel for a record and he was the first horse to beat 2:30 over a Nova-Scotia track. At the recent meeting Billy C. won the free-for-all in 2:16 1/2, 2:16 1/2, 2:15 1/2, during the seven days there were seventeen races, and in every one of which 2:30 was beaten, not only by aged horses, but by two and three-year-olds; Baron Cecil, a three-year-old, trotted in 2:24 1/2 in a race against aged horses, while Baring's Comet, a two-year-old, trotted in 2:28 1/2, or only a quarter second slower than the mile made famous by Israel, Brazilian (the sire of Billy C.) was the champion two-year-old of the year, and trotted a mile at Halifax against time in 2:48 1/2. Parkside was the champion three-year-old of that year, and took a record of 2:34 at Charlottetown.

The Cincinnati Reds played great ball during their last Eastern trip, producing the same high class work they showed early in the season.

### SENSATIONAL RACING AT COLUMBUS TRACK

Columbus, O., Sept. 26—Sensational racing marked the program at the Driving Park this afternoon, a new world's record for a fifth heat being established in the free-for-all trot when the Cleveland mare Grace defeated Dudie Archdale, Billy Burk and Bracc Giraffe.

The chestnut colt Adion, favorite in the betting, beat a high-class field in the Horse Review Futurity for 5-year-old trotters, this race being the fastest of the season by a 3-year-old.

The Cox pacer, Branham Baughman, repeated his Detroit performance by defeating Don Pronto and others in the 2:05 pace, while the 2:15 trot in which the largest field of the season started, was carried over until tomorrow after four heats.

Miguel Gonzales, the Boston Braves new catcher is a Cuban and doesn't speak English. "Hub" Perdue is an American and doesn't speak Spanish, which makes the Braves standing 500 in the language league.

New York, Sept. 27—Mike Gibbons of St. Paul, Minn., and Eddie McGoorty of Oshkosh, Wis., have been matched to meet here for the middleweight "championship of the world" November 7. The announcement was made tonight by the Garden A. C. The bout will be for ten rounds at 158 pounds ringside.

### "KNOCKOUT" BROWN WON

Cleveland, Ohio, Sept. 28—"Knockout" Brown of New York, out-boxed and out-fought Sammy Trot of Columbus, in their scheduled twelve round bout before the Cleveland Athletic Club last night and the fight was stopped in the eighth round by Referee W. C. Kelly to save Trot from a knockout.
