MARKET REPORT

(By J. M. Robinson & Son)

St. John, Sept. 28.—The New York stock market at last shows some signs of awakening. The transactions for this week have been larger than for some time past, and the trend has been very distinctly upward. All indications point to a bull market of moderate dimensions during this Autumn, of which this week is the beginning.

MONEY

This upward movement has begun in spite of quite a serious tightness in the money market; rates in New York have been as high as 6 p.c., this week, and call money is ruling all the way from 5 p.c. to 6 p.c., in fact at one time the quotation for call money in New York was as high as 7 p.c. This is due to the fact that money all the world over is well distributed, consequently the Western call for funds this year is more seriously felt than has been the case for some years. Interest at the current rates however, has never been known to discourage a good movement on the Stock Exchange, provided the public are behind it, and this seems to be the case at present. In a couple of months money will be returned from the West in volume, and it is not likely that the present rates will maintain for very long.

One of the features of higher money is the decline in short term investment securities, practically all the short term notes are now quoted on an income basis, at from 5 p.c. to 7 p.c., where a few months ago the rate was fully 1 p.c. less, these notes are now, so to speak, on the bargain counter, and as most of them mature in 1914 and 1915 form very attractive investments.

NEW YORK

In discussing the market situation our New York correspondent says as follows:

"The stock market has been literally lifted out of its long continued rut by force of buying on a large and general scale, evidently by a group of considerable weight and financial ability.

This speculative demonstration has met with success as technical market conditions have lent themselves readily to buying owing to the absence of opposition and the moderate speculative commitments hitherto outstanding.

MONTREAL

Dominion canners has made another erratic move this week, which does not tend to increase the confidence of the public in the stock, but nevertheless, there is merit behind it and sooner or later it should sail much higher. Do not think interests in control can defer giving the shareholders a dividend on their holdings. On sharp breaks it should be a purchase.

Textile has been very steady with narrow fluctuations, but people close to interests identified with the Company look for a further advance in it, and that the stock will be placed on a 6 p.c. basis.

The rise in Toronto Rails has been on buying from the West where it is rumored that a bonus will be declared at the end of the year. It is also rumored that it is the intention of the management to give bonuses from time to time to the shareholders until the expiration of the present franchise. This stock if bought on a reaction should show reasonable profits.

FIVE AWAIT DEATH IN MONTREAL JAIL

Montreal, Sept. 27.—When Carla Battiste, was this morning ushered into the death room at the Montreal jail, he swelled the number to five, the greatest a Canadian jail has sheltered for nearly a century.

Probably the nearest approach in all Canada to the dead record occurred in 1888, when five men were hanged for treason. But that was in the dark and troublesome days of '38, and this is 1912.

Battiste, makes the third Italian and the fifth man condemned to death, three Italians, one Russian and one Scotman. The first hanging takes place, one week from today, when John Cummings, who murdered his wife, will be executed and the other four will take place about three weeks apart.

PREPARING FOR CAMPAIGN PROBE

Washington, D.C., Sept. 27.—The members of the senate subcommittee appointed to investigate campaign expenditures of which Senator Clapp of Minnesota is chairman, met here today to perfect plans for the hearings. These hearings are scheduled to begin next Monday on which date all witnesses have been instructed to appear. Among the important witnesses summoned to tell what they knew concerning contributions to the presidential campaign funds of four years ago are George B. Cortelyou, William Loeb Jr., ex-Senator Charles Dick of Ohio, ex-Senator Nathan B. Scott of West Virginia, Henry C.

Frick, William R. Hearst, William Rockefeller and George W. Perkins. It is understood also that Col. Roosevelt will voluntarily appear to answer any questions that may be asked him concerning his knowledge of Standard Oil and other corporation contributions to the Republican campaign fund in 1908.
