CIDER FAIRLY GENUINE

Ottawa, Ont., July 22—Cider has sold throughout the Dominion in the whole a fairly genuine article. Of 33 samples bearing labels "Cider" collected from various parts of Canada by the Inland Revenue Department, 27 met legal requirements of the act containing not more than seven per cent. of alcohol. Six samples appear to have water added to the apple juice. Out of 36 samples sold as Sweet Cider, only eight met the legal definition, but it is pointed out that the definition does not really apply to some of the samples with modified names such as "Champagne Cider," "Raspberry Cider," etc. Chief Analyst McGill says in the samples analyzed the addition of anything harmful to health, was small.
