## MORE LIQUOR SOLD

Reports from Chicago that saloon keepers by the score are quitting business this month and that some estimates placed the number as high as 500 out of the 7,000 establishments waether similar conditions are pre-valling in New York. There has been a steady decrease in the number of licenses in recent years, but not in any such proportion as that reported from Chicago, and various reasons are given for the decline.

And while the number of saloons in New York City has been decreasing there appears to be no diminution in the amount of liquors consumed, for the last report of the State Commission of the State Com

shows that 29,774 men were committed for disorderly conduct while intoxicated, an increase of 2,080 over the previous year, and 7,649 women were sentenced for public intoxication.

The excise year in New York runs from September 30 to September 30, 1909-9, there were 5,982 licenses issued for saloons in Manhattan and the Bronx, according to John B. Trainor, cashier for the Excise Department. In 1909-10 there were 5,927; in 1910-11 there were 5,610 and for the period September 30, 1911, to date, 5,491, and Mr. Trainor estimates that perhaps thirty more may be issued this year, which would bring the total


