ROBBED OF LOVE, KILLED HIMSELF

Chicago, Ill., May 21.—Life, crowned with success in everything but love, was useless to Henry Spruck von Armenthal, of Seattle, owner of extensive apple orchards of noble German lineage, and he ended his days with a bullet in his room in the Palmer House, Saturday night.

Drink crumbled for him a romance which started two years ago in Los Angeles, Cal., in a chance meeting with Mrs. Frances Rosenblatt, niece of the late Nelson Morris, pork packer.

Hotel attaches, who found the body, discovered a revolver in one hand of Mr. Spruck and a photograph of Mrs. Rosenblatt, in the other.

Mr. Von Armenthal was rescued from a week of dissipation which included arrest and two days in the county jail. Walter D. Jones, his Chicago attorney, effected his release from jail, but Mrs. Rosenblatt would not be reconciled.

Mr. von Armenthal's pleas and offer of \$50,000 marriage settlement were unavailing with the young widow.

"You must straighten up and show yourself to be a man," she insisted. He left after four hours of pleading.

He had made a will giving all his extensive properties, including apple orchards in Washington, Oregon and Idaho, to a brother, Philip Spruck, Baron Solms Sanbach von Armenthal of Hessen Darmstadt. This was forwarded to his Seattle attorneys as shown in a letter left by the suicide. The writer also left a "statement to the press," which reads in part:—

"I have several times contemplated destroying myself within the last two years and drink is the cause of all. In a moment of despondency I take my own life. I love the finest woman in the world, yet while I know she loves me dearly, she left me in disgust several days ago for parts unknown. The facts are that I am disgusted with myself.

"My lawyer at Seattle to whom I shall wire at the last moment shall attend to all proper matters. Further, I want my body held at an undertaking establishment for at least four days until his arrival, and he may select a burying place. No ceremonies, strictly private."

Mrs. Rosenblatt for a number of years resided in New York, where her late husband, Benjamin Rosenblatt was a leather manufacturer.

INTERESTING LETTER FROM THE FAR NORTH

Mrs. Thomas Patchell formerly of this city who with her husband has been residing in Alaska for some years writes as follows to The Mail: Flat Creek Iditarod, Alaska March 9th, 1912

Editor of the Mail,—Dear Sir,—Enclosed you will find \$5.00 to be applied to my subscription to the Mail kindly send me a receipt. I thought while writing I would tell you something of the country which would possibly be of some interest to your many readers.

This is a gold mining camp two years old. Last year close to two million dollars was taken out of two creeks with no little hope is expressed by a good many miners of several other creeks in the immediate vicinity. This coming season we expect great things of our little camp and we all look forward to the time when we can procure enough gold dust to leave this desolate country and go home to good old Canada. There are quite a number of Canadians here out of our population of 2,000 and as we must expect in this far north to meet good and bad of all nationality. There has been many murders, suicides and robberies and there is no comparison with the Canadian laws. If a man commits a crime here the marshal waits until some one swears out a warrant before he can act, but it is not so with the Dawson boys. They are upon the scene almost as soon as the law is broken, and they always come back with their prisoner. The climate here this winter has been beautiful; very little cold weather and only two feet of snow. The cost of living is very expensive. Meats of all kinds are 75 cents a pound over the rest; eggs \$2.00 per dozen; Native eggs \$3.00; ham and bacon 35 cents a pound; butter \$1.00 per pound; flour \$20.00 per hundred. And other things in proportion. Our social life we engage in dancing basket ball and card parties. We have a beautiful hall 50ft. x 100ft which cost \$10,000.

We have some grand balls. On Dec. 25th, St. John's Day the Masonic Clubs gave a ball, about seventy-five couples attended. They also celebrated Washington's birthday on Feb. 22nd. I am sending you a photo of the banquet taken by flash light. 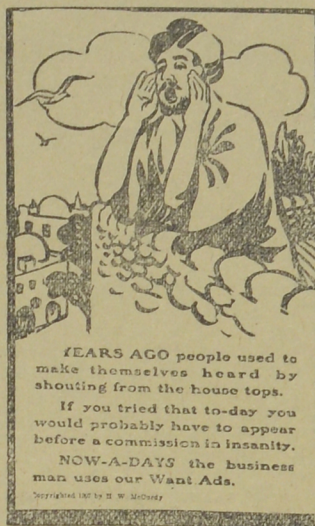
