After many rumors of absorption by various banks and subsequent denials, a sale was finally made to Sir Henry Pellatt today. The sum of \$286,000 was Oompany for 52,275 shares of stoc held in France. The money, however was no sooner paid to the National Trust Company than seizure made upon it, and now it is tied up pending a long legal fight.

The firm of Sir Rodolphe Forget made the seizure, as some twenty of Paris shareholders of the Interna tional Bank are indebted to the Paris agency of the firm.

The legal fight may tie up the money for some months. In the meantime the Pellat syndicate are in control of the bank, and will undoubtedly proceed with their plans. The present trouble is a personal one between Sir R. Forget and the Parisian shareholders of the bank.
