

Deliveries have been satisfactory amounting to 7.390 stds., 'com-pared with 8,860 stds last year; stocks are now very low amounting to 13,070 stds., compared with 22,880 at this time last year and as the arrivals for the remainder of the season will undoubtedly be light, a further advance in values has been established, last sales being at extreme figures.'






