AN ELDERLY WOMAN BEATEN TO DEATH

(Canadian Press)

Montreal, March 5.—Apparently beaten to death with a heavy piece of curtain pole, Mrs. Maggie Burney, an elderly English woman, was found dead last night by her son in a wretched hovel in Coupl Lane, an alleyway in the east end of the city. The two men with whom the woman has been living for the past three months, are being held by the police. The pair who give their names as Henry and Fred Seybold, accuse each other of having caused the woman's death, and both claim to have been out when the woman received the beating which resulted in her death. When found by her son, Mrs. Burney had been dead two days, her body having lain in the house since Saturday, the two men, both drunk, apparently not considering that anything serious had occurred.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR OPENING OF LEGISLATURE

Hon. Josiah Wood, accompanied by his daughter Mrs. F. B. Black of Sackville, arrived in the city last night and took up his residence in his apartments at the Barker House. Mr. R. S. Barker, private secretary to the lieutenant governor received Hon. Mr. Wood at the C. P. R. station. The new lieutenant governor will probably be sworn in on Wednesday or Thursday.

The provincial government is in session today preparing for the session which opens upon Thursday. All members are present with the exception of Hon. H. F. McLeod who left for Ottawa last evening. Premier Flemming stated this afternoon that the business transacted was chiefly routine.

Preparations at the House of Assembly for the opening of the legislature are being made under the direction of Mr. H. M. Blair, secretary of Public Works. Recently a clash occurred between Mr. Blair and one of the messengers of the Departmental Building with the result that orders were issued that the messenger was to be allowed about the building as little as possible.

The bye-elections and changes in the government during the year have made necessary several changes in the seating on the floor of the house. Premier Flemming takes the seat lately occupied by Hon. J. D. Hazen. Hon. W. C. H. Grimmer, Chief Commissioner Morrissey, Hon. Robt. Maxwell and Hon. Mr. Murray move up one seat. Mr. W. B. Dixon takes Hon. Mr. Murray's old seat. Lt. Col. Baxter takes Mr. Hartt's seat. Mr. Perley takes Mr. Lowell's seat and Mr. Guptell takes Mr. Dixon's seat.

3. Establishment of central bureau by provincial government where immigrants can apply for reliable information, and assistance and provision of officials whose duty it would be to visit new settlers offering assistance and suggestions, Mr. Scott, Meductic.

5. Assistance of the Federal Government for immigration to the eastern provinces, T. H. Estabrooks, St. John.

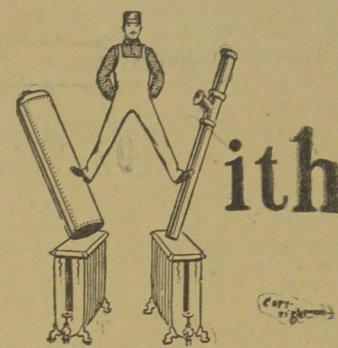
