### MORE STUDENTS

### FOR RESEARCH WORK

Ottawa, July 24—The Dominion archives branch is formulating a scheme for the re-organization of the system for the preservation of provincial documents which are and will, become of historical interest. The government is also considering the advisability of bringing an additional number of students from universities and colleges throughout the Dominion each year for study and research since this scheme was inaugurated some years ago a number of students from various universities come here each summer at the government's expense and the good work obtained is evidenced from the letters of recommendation from the heads of colleges throughout the Dominion.

Dr. Dougherty of the Archives is now in the maritime provinces in connection with the preserving of historical documents.

### THIRD PARTY MOVEMENT IN KENTUCKY

Louisville, Ky., July 27—The third party movement in Kentucky is expected to take tangible shape tomorrow, when mass conventions are to be held by the Roosevelt adherents in many counties throughout the state. The county conventions are to select delegates to the district conventions, which in turn are to name representatives to attend the state conference scheduled to be held in this city the first week in August. The state conference is to consist of twenty-six delegates, all of whom are expected to go from Louisville to Chicago to attend the national Progressive convention on August 5. The active leadership in the work of organizing the third party movement in this state is being taken by Leslie Combs of Lexington, who was in the diplomatic service during the Roosevelt administration.

### HAMILTON PRISONER

### COMMITTED SUICIDE

Hamilton, Ont., July 26—Harry Gilmore, charged with non-support committed suicide at the central police station this morning a few minutes before his case was to have been called. He was in the witness room with his wife when he suddenly took a small bottle of cyanide acid out of his pocket and swallowed the contents. He died within a few minutes.

### OFFICIALS OUT ON MAN HUNT

Carmel, Me., July 26—Search for a degenerate farmer and generally believed to have been the murderer of Naomi, Etta Mitchell, the fourteen-year-old daughter of Phineas Mitchell whose mutilated body was found yesterday between her home and the village grocery store at North Carmel was resumed at daybreak today by the county officials. They had no other suspects in mind. Several clues had been furnished and a number of people are said to have seen him but he had not been located up to an early hour today.

A general outlook was being maintained within a radius of twenty-five miles and more than a dozen officers were actively engaged in the man hunt.

### HONOR HELPER OF THE DEAF

Paris, July 27—An interesting celebration will be opened in Paris tomorrow to mark the bicentenary of the birth of Abbe de l'Epee, inventor of the deaf and dumb alphabet. The celebration will last four days and will include an international congress of deaf mutes, which will be attended by delegates from many countries.

Abbe de l'Epee was the first of the great teachers of the deaf and dumb. He was educated for the priesthood but took up the work of teaching the deaf and dumb before the field had been entered by anyone else. He was successful and invented the manual alphabet, which was a great aid in his work and has since remained a standard device.

### SUFFRAGETTE LEADER

### WAS DISCHARGED

Oxford, July 26—Dr. Ethel Smith, the suffragette leader who was arrested on July 25 on a charge of complicity in the attempt to burn down the historic residence of Lewis Harcourt, secretary of state for the colonies, at Nunham Park on July 13, was discharged by the police magistrate today owing to the failure of witnesses to identify her.

Two women were seen in the grounds of Mr. Harcourt's residence on July 13, by the night watchman, and one of them, Helen Craggs, daughter of Sir Chas. Craggs, was arrested while the other escaped. Miss Craggs was carrying a quantity of combustible material and spirits.

These reports showed gratifying progress during the past year, especially in the great mission undertaken by the Gideons of placing a Bible in every guest room of every hotel throughout the United States and Canada. At the present time, according to the reports, the work is being continued at the rate of about 5,000 Bibles a month.
