## BLUE FOXES ARRIVE FOR ST. JOHN FARM

(St. John Telegraph)

After travelling nearly four thousand miles, twenty-five pairs of blue foxes arrived in the city yesterday in a baggage car attached to the Atlantic express. They were immediately taken through to the fox farm of the Provincial Fox Co., Ltd., at Renforth. The little animals were all fine specimens of their breed and appeared to have suffered no ill effects from their long journey. There are twenty-five males and twenty-five females in the shipment.

F. E. Williams, who is one of the chief stock holders in the Provincial Fox Co., Ltd., told the Telegraph last night that the foxes had been secured in Alaska and that they were all quite young. Some of them had been in their crates for thirty-five days but all seemed as frisky as though they were fresh from their native haunts.

On their journey across the continent they were accompanied by Mr. Whelpley, who has charge of a ranch at Renforth. On the trip the foxes were fed on different kinds of food but beef, fish and milk formed their chief article of diet. The ranch at Renforth is said to be the largest in the maritime provinces and has several silver foxes as well as this new stock of blues.

Mr. Williams said that the company expected to bring more of the blue foxes here in a short time, and the business of raising fur bearing animals would be undertaken on a much larger scale.

New Westminster, B. C., Oct. 31.—A second death as a result of the attempted jail delivery from the penitentiary here on October 5th, occurred this morning when H. Wilson, a highway robber, died. He was shot through the neck while attempting to escape.

### BEGINS 50th YEAR OF RULERSHIP

Athens, Oct. 31.—King George of Greece who again looms large in the public eye by reason of the flame of war that appears to be rapidly spreading over southeastern Europe, today enters upon the fiftieth year of his reign. Next to the venerable Emperor of Austria he is the oldest of the sovereigns of Europe. Born a prince of Denmark he was proclaimed King of the Hellenes by the national assembly of Greece on March 30, 1863. He was then seventeen years old. On October 30 of the same year he arrived in Athens, and on the following day he took the oath and mounted the throne.

When the future King arrived in Athens forty-nine years ago today, he was welcomed by a little nation of a million people. He has more than two million subjects now, and Greece has progressed very creditably under his rulership. Though Greece has been overtaken by severe political storms during the past half century the throne of King George has never once been seriously threatened. No one doubts that the King has a genuine love for his adopted country and at the present moment shares to the utmost degree the dream of every Greek of making the Aegean Sea a Grecian lake, as it was in the palmy days of ancient Athens, and at seeing her flag float from the minarets of Constantinople on that day which may not be far distant, when the Ottoman shall be expelled from Europe.

The ceremony was performed in the old Wrightsville Chapel at Airlie, the country home of the bride's parents, who are numbered among the social leaders of New York and Newport. The family has been prominent in Wilmington since before the war and still maintains a country home here.

### MICHIGAN TEACHERS IN SESSION

Grand Rapids, Oct. 31.—With every prospect of a busy and profitable session, the members of the Michigan State Teachers' Association gathered in Grand Rapids today and began their annual convention. The programme covers two days and provides for the discussion of every branch of educational work together with addresses by such widely known educators as President Henry C. King of Oberlin College, Lotus D. Coffman of the University of Illinois, E. T. Fairchild, State superintendent of public instruction of Kansas and Charles A. Prosser of New York secretary of the Society for the Promotion of Industrial Education.

## TORONTO MILITIAMEN KILLED IN SMASHUP

Toronto, Oct. 29.—Two members of the Toronto garrison were killed and thirty-nine injured, two fatally, as the result of a head-on collision near Streetville Junction, on the Canadian Pacific Railway. The Chicago flyer, which pulled out of Toronto at five o'clock, crashed into the second section of a train bringing home the troops engaged in the sham battle from Milton to Toronto. All of those on the wrecked train were Torontonians.

## TO CHOOSE SUCCESSOR TO VICE-PRES. SHERMAN

New York, Oct. 31.—Chairman Hill of the Republican National Committee early this morning announced that he had called a meeting of the National Committee for November 12th in Chicago to select a successor to the late Jas. E. Sherman as the Republican Candidate for Vice-President.

Mr. Hill made the following statement: "The National convention, which met in Chicago in June delegated to the National Committee power to fill vacancies on the National ticket. The death of Mr. Sherman, candidate of the Republican party for Vice-President at the coming election, makes it incumbent upon the National Committee to nominate a candidate in his place. The nomination, however, cannot possibly be made prior to the election next Tuesday. Such a nomination can properly be made only after due reasonable notice to all the members of the committee. cannot be given in less than six days. It is therefore, manifestly impossible to hold such a meeting prior to the election. Meantime, no difficulty or inconvenience arises to the voters at the election next Tuesday, because the votes to be cast then are for electors and not for candidates for either president or vice-president, and the death of Mr. Sherman, therefore does not affect the validity of the election of the electors."

### ON TRIAL FOR DOUBLE MURDER

Shreveport, Oct. 31.—The details of one of the most diabolical murder plots ever executed in this section of the country are expected to be unravelled in the trial of Albert E. Watson which has commenced here. Watson and Mrs. Eva Walls Bailey are charged jointly with successfully plotting to murder the wife of the man, and the husband of the woman in order that their own, illicit love affair might end in marriage.

C. C. Bailey a wealthy lumber mill owner and husband of the woman defendant was hacked to death with an axe at his home on September 2 last. Watson, whose intimacy with Mrs. Bailey had already attracted attention was immediately taken into custody. The next day he is said to have made a detailed confession of the crime to the authorities.

According to the alleged confession, Watson came to Louisiana in the early summer after having poisoned his wife in a Texas town. Some months previously according to the confession Watson and Mrs. Bailey had entered into a compact by which Watson was to poison his wife and Mrs. Bailey her husband. Watson did away with his wife without arousing suspicion, but repeated efforts by Mrs. Bailey it is said failed because she did not know how to administer the poison.

Watson came to Louisiana and obtained work in Bailey's mill. Bailey became suspicious and quarrelled with his wife. This resulted in hurriedly plotting Mrs. Bailey
