C.P.R. MAY GET RUNNING RIGHTS

Ottawa, April 15—It is not improbable that the Canadian Pacific may secure the right to haul its own trains over the Intercolonial between St. John and Halifax. At present the passenger trains of the C.P.R. run into Halifax but they are hauled by I.C.R. crews. The Canadian Pacific is anxious and have for a long time been anxious to handle its own trains right through. It is thought that the minister of railways is inclined to grant the privilege, and it may be coupled with the double tracks of the I.C.R. from Halifax to Moncton and possibly on to St. John. If this were done easier grades would be sought for there has been proposals to the government for the construction of a line to Georgian Bay with government aid, and with the right given the I.C.R. to make use of the tracks.

A SCHEME FOR THE PROTECTIVE INTERESTS

(Montreal Witness)

Our own view of the Tariff Board is that it is a device for the protection of protection. Mr. Ames, indeed, has told us so. It can get real information only from the beneficiaries of protection. The Senate did not venture to vote the measure down, as it would have done had it been an elective House, but it amended it so as to require the Commission to find out the number of workers employed in any industry, the dividends earned by the manufacturers, and the names of the directors. Mr. White's only objection to this was that it was covered by a general clause which declared that the Commission should investigate "all conditions and factors" which affect or enter into the cost of "production to the consumers." That Mr. White did not really think that this clause covered these requirements is plain from the fact that he preferred to accept the defeat of the great measure of the session to be inclusion of words in it that would have specifically demanded information of such real value to the public and so germane to the question. In making such a demand the Senate did a work for the country that it can well stand by. If it is proposed to raise the duty on cement, for instance, and to levy a new tax on every one, it is most necessary that the country should know how many workers are employed what these workers earn, to what extent the capital invested was watered, and who are the men who will derive the profit. To tax the whole country to pay a high rate of interest on stock that is mostly water for the benefit of a combination of wealth would not be a proposition that could be safely laid before the people at present.

QUEBEC ELECTIONS TO BE HELD MAY 15

Quebec, April 15—The legislative assembly was dissolved this morning by the Lt. Governor in council. The nominations for general elections will take place on the eighth of May and the polling on the fifteenth.

This decision was made known by Premier Gouin after a meeting of the cabinet. Hon. Mr. Devlin will run in the new Temiskaming County. There will be eight members more in the new legislature, the number of seats having been increased from 74 to 82 at the last session.

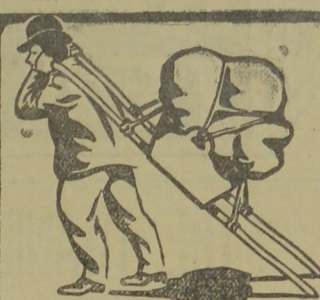
