Will Play Acadia Thursday Afternoon — Cain Playing, Trimble Uncertain— Game With King's

The rugby football team of the University of New Brunswick got away Tuesday on its trip to Wolfville to play the first match in the Western Section. Intercollegiate League, against Acadia University. The game will be played Thursday afternoon.

The U. N. B. team as announced at the time of its departure is as follows: Fullback, Mackenzie; Halfbacks, Dummer, Hagerman, Cain, C. Seely; Quarterback, Willatt, Slip; Lounsbury Forwards Bishop, Gilmore, Scovill, Squires, Miller, Akerley, Jewett. Substitute back is Haines and the substitute forwards Bridges, Rogers, P. B. Seely.

The lineup as given does not show Capt. Trimble. He accompanied the team however and if his condition should permit will play against Acadia. In that event Cain will play in place of Willett. The team will travel via Digby.

An exhibition match with Kings College at Windsor has been arranged for Friday and the team will return to Fredericton Saturday night. Jack Asten coach of the team did not accompany it.

PHOTOGRAPHER ETIQUETTE

New York, Oct. 25.—The enterprise of a New York photographer broke down the barrier of military etiquette in arranging a meeting between Admiral Beatty of the British Admiralty Gen. Armando Diaz, Italian Commander-in-Chief, and Lieut. Gen. Jacques of the Belgian Army.

The three officers arrived at the Pennsylvania station to board the special train that was to take them to Washington. The cameraman conceived the idea of a group picture. He enlisted the aid of Stationmaster Maurice Egan, who communicated with Admiral Beatty and obtained his consent to pose. Then Gen. Jacques was appealed to and he, too, consented.

But when the photographer's purpose was explained to an aid of Gen. Diaz, who was in his private car waiting for the train to start, the aid insisted that military etiquette required "if that be done" the other military men must first pay their respects to Gen. Diaz in his car.

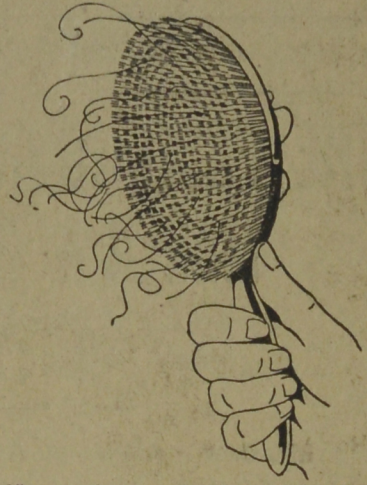
