WESTERNERS WANT INCREASE IN BRITISH PREFERENCE

Edmonton, Sept. 4.—Probably because it was savoured much of politics the Duke of Connaught in his reply to Mayor Armstrong's address of welcome at the opening of the new legislative buildings here yesterday did not refer to a passage in the address in which a significant allusion to reciprocity was made. The address contained the following passage:

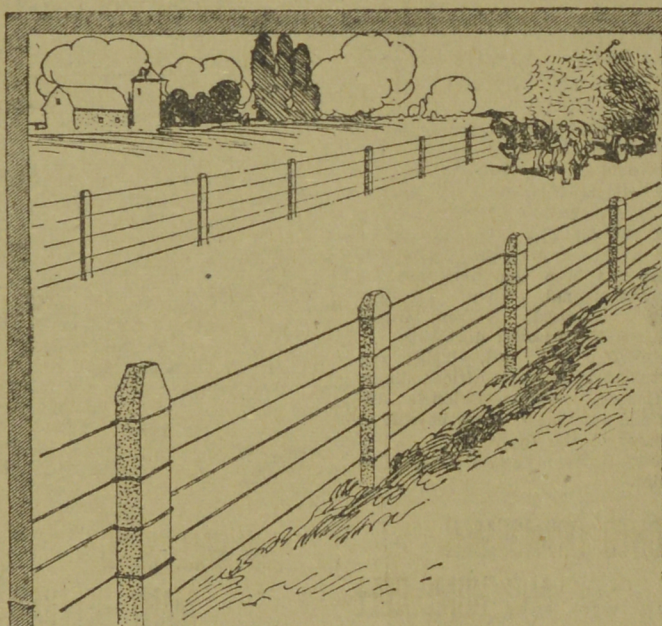
"For many years Canadians have demonstrated to the world their attachment and loyalty to the mother land by giving a decided preference and a decided ease of entrance to British wares and British manufacturers and we in Western Canada at all events are willing, nay, anxious to further emphasize our practical loyalty to advocating a farther increase of that preference."

We believe that such increase would be mutually beneficial to Canada and the United States and the British Isles cognizant however of the fact that this young nation, mainly agricultural, is but on the very threshold of its tremendous possibilities as to production. It is incumbent upon us as we are true to our best interests to use all lawful endeavors to enlarge our commercial bounds in order that ready markets may be obtained for the ever increasing products of soil to the end that our people may know that they are subject to only fair commercial and economic and in order that the very results may be obtained for those and those only shall content and loyalty rest upon a permanent and abiding basis."

REFUSED TO BE VACCINATED.

Halifax, N. S., Sept. 3.—Fifteen men at the Nova Scotia military camp at Aldershot were dismissed today because they refused to be vaccinated. The rule is that if a soldier is not vaccinated when he arrives at the camp, this must be done that day or the day after. Six men from the 66th P. L. F., and ten from the 63rd Rifles had not been vaccinated and refused to allow it. Accordingly their accoutrements were taken from them, they were dismissed and were escorted under guard from the camp to the railway and sent home. One of them was a sergeant.
