GIRL CAPTURED WHILE WEARING STOLEN PROPERTY

Florence Forbes of Waasis Held on Serious Charge--Stole Valuable Pin From Regent Street Residence

Florence Forbes, aged eighteen years whose home is at Waasis appeared this morning before Police Magistrate Marsh on the charge of stealing a lady's dress and a valuable diamond pin from the home of Mr. Harry G. Ripley, Regent Street. She was remanded till Friday.

The accused has worked as a domestic servant at several residences in the city. On Monday she went to work at the residence of Mr. Ripley who is superintendent for the T. M. Foundation Company, Ltd., on the work at the Highway Bridge. Tuesday morning she left her employment there and soon after her departure it was noticed that a diamond pin valued at \$125 and a lady's dress had disappeared. The police were notified and proceeded to work on the case. The girl was not to be found and her haunts in the city were not known. Chief McCollom and Special Policeman Roberts went to the girl's home at Waasis but failed to find her. Places where she stayed while in Fredericton were learned, however, and it was afterward found out that the girl had been staying at a house on King Street.

Harry McNeill of Maplegrove, in the Parish of Stanley, was painfully injured Monday in an accident which attended the moving of a house in that place. He had a leg broken and was also seriously injured internally, the building falling on him and crushing him. Nevertheless, he is expected to live.

This took some time, it being necessary to cut through one of the sills of the house before McNeill could be freed. In the meantime he was suffering intense pain.

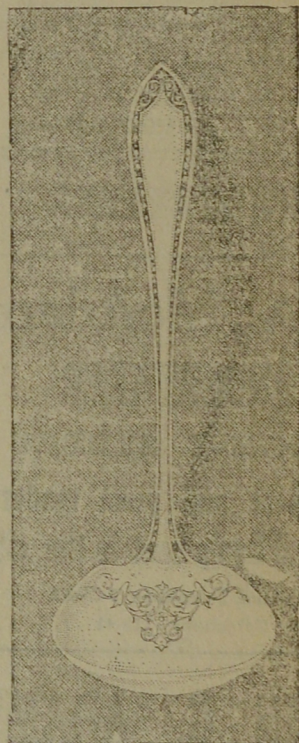
