CANADA'S CREDIT SUFFERS

Canada's credit is distinctly suffermanagement of Hon, W. T. White, Mr. Borden's finance minister. During fifteen years, Hon. W. S. Fielding had carefully guarded the credit of the Dominion as one of its most precious assets. Loans were avoided as far as possible and when they were required, such was the confidence inspired by Hon. The last Liberal government loan cost a fraction more than 3½ per 000,000 5 per cent. notes in London cent. 
