REVALUATION OF
PROPERTY IN CITY
IS DESIRED

Legislation for the Appointment of Commissioners Likely to be Sought
---Last Valuation Made Fourteen Years Ago

It is understood that the City Council will be urged to apply for legislation at the next session of the House of Assembly for the appointment of commissioners to revalue the assessable property in the City of Fredericton. It is claimed that real estate within the limits of the city has increased in value to a considerable extent and that a revaluation of property is imperative in fairness to ratepayers and to the city corporation.

The valuation of property in this city was last made fourteen years ago, special legislation appointing commissioners for the purpose being secured. The commissioners at that time were Havelock Coy, John Hodge and the late James Farrell. It is thought that in fourteen years the values of property have altered to such an extent that a revaluation is necessary.

The assessors are said to be desirous of a revaluation on account of dissatisfaction expressed by citizens on account of increases made by the assessors at the time of the last assessment. By many citizens it is urged that revaluation should be made regularly at intervals of a few years.

OLD VOTERS' LISTS
MUST BE USED AT
BY-ELECTIONS

New List Not Yet Revised--Those Who Recently Took up Residence in York County Will be Disfranchised

The Dominion by-election in the County of York, which has been called for Wednesday, January 7, will be run on the old voters' lists as the new lists have not yet been revised by the sheriff and will not be in readiness for some time. The old lists must be used and consequently residents of York who have come to the county within the past year will not be entitled to voting powers. This means that a considerable number of people will be disfranchised. The old lists contained names which numbered a few hundred more than eight thousand. It is claimed that the lists now under preparation will contain a considerably larger number of names.

The final revision of the new lists is to be made by the sheriff and they will then be forwarded to Ottawa by the county secretary-treasurer. They will be printed at the Dominion capital and sent back. It is probable that the by-election to be held to fill the vacancy in York's representation in the provincial parliament, which will result from the expected nomination of Hon. H. F. McLeod for Ottawa, will be run on the new lists.

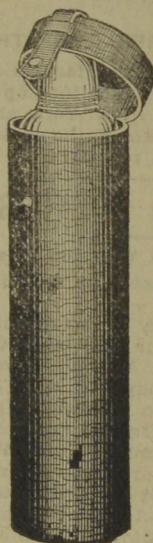

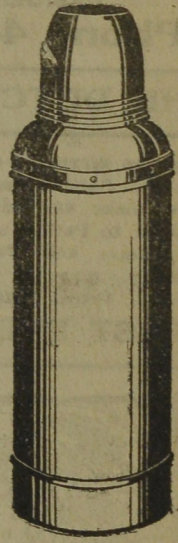
