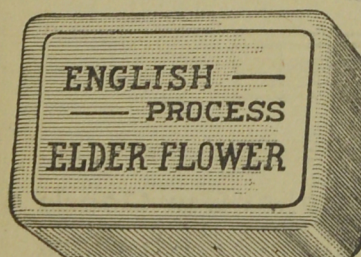

WOULD NOT VIOLATE
ASHBURTON TREATY

Ottawa, Oct. 9.—An international
commission appointed by the Cana-
dian and United States governments
to inquire into the damming of the
St. John River by the St. John
Hydro-Electric Company, and to in-
vestigate, especially, the charge that
the proposed works are a violation
of the Ashburton treaty, has sub-
mitted a report to the Hon. Robert
Rogers, minister of public works. It
upholds the contention of the hydro-
electric company.

The dam, which is to be erected
on the St. John River, between the
Shogomoc and Pokiok streams, was
authorized by an act of the legisla-
ture but protests came from the lum-
bering and fishing interests both in
New Brunswick and Maine. The com-
mission reports that the dam, if
built according to the act, would not
prevent free access to the sea at St.
John within the meaning of the Ash-
burton treaty but it finds that the
weight of evidence goes to show that
it might impede the passage of sal-
mon to the spawning grounds.

The commission is composed of M.
G. Teed and John Keefe, represent-
ing Canada, and G. L. Murchie and
Peter Keegan for the United States.
