MANY OPERA NOVELTIES PROMISED

New York, Nov. 15—What promises to be the most varied and interesting grand opera season New York has ever enjoyed will be opened Monday night at the Metropolitan Opera House. The initial attraction will be Massenet's "Manon," with Caruso, Farrar, and Scotti, in the principal roles.

Five novelties will be given during the season of 23 weeks—Gustave Charpentier's "Julien," for which occasion the celebrated French composer will visit this country; Richard Strauss' "Der Rosenkavalier;" Italo Montemezzi's "L'Amore dei Tre Re," a successful opera by an Italian not yet known here; Wolf-Ferrari's "L'Amore Medico," the libretto of which is based upon Moliere's comedy, "L'Amour Médecin," and Victor Herbert's one-act opera, "Madelaine," which is to be sung in English.

All of last season's important principals have returned—Mmes. Farrar, Gadsni, Fremstad, Destinn, Alda, Rappold, Homer, Bori, Alten, and Hempel; Messrs. Caruso, Jora, Burrian, Urtis, Martin, Scotti, Amato, Gilly, Goriti, Paganini, Griswold, Rothier, Reiss and Witherspoon.

Among the new artists to be heard during the season are three new tenors. They are Giovanni Martinelli, an Italian lyric tenor; Rudolf Brer, of the Berlin Opera, and Luigi Mancini, a light Italian tenor. Other new comers will include Mme. Margaret Ober, contralto of the Berlin Opera, and two American singers, Misses Sophia Breslau and Lillian Eulank.

that the warrant issued in Halifax on which the girl was arrested here, was not good in law and that the arrest was illegal but that the legality could not affect the case. On these grounds he ordered the prisoner's discharge.

Judge Wilson stated that he had not taken into consideration Mr. Hughes' point that the girl was under the age of fourteen and consequently innocent in the eyes of the law as he considered the matter hinged on the warrant. He held that no offense in law had been charged against her and mentioned the facts that the offense had not been sufficiently defined and that the girl had not been asked to give an account of herself.

DETECTIVE WAITING.

Up to 3.30 the order for the discharge of Eva Smith from the county jail had not been taken out by her counsel. Detective Hanrahan was waiting at the jail-door to re-arrest her.

OFFENSES ACKNOWLEDGED.

Three cases of violation of the Canada Temperance Act were acknowledged before the police magistrate this morning. All were first offenses and the usual fines were imposed. Information was by the city police.

ricks because he had wronged her. Relatives of the slain man, however, vigorously deny that any such cause existed for the tragedy and they have announced their intention to aid in the prosecution of the young girl. On the day of the tragedy Kendrick had gone to the Perdue home to get his little child, born to the father's union over six years ago with a sister of the girl who killed him. Accompanying Kendrick to the house was his second wife, a bride of three weeks. As Kendrick stepped into the dining room, Letha Perdue entered the room from the other side.

"Well," said Kendrick, "get the baby ready—I want to take him home with me."

"Jim," said the young girl, "what do you mean by treating me in this way? You asked me to marry you and we were engaged. You knew I loved you and I thought you loved me."

"You are a liar," exclaimed Kendrick, according to the members of the Perdue family who witnessed the tragedy. "I never did intend to marry you."

Kendrick, according to the girl's statements, then started toward her with a threatening gesture. Whipping a revolver from the folds of her skirt, the girl began firing. The first bullet went through Kendrick's shoulder and he grappled with his assailant. A second shot was fired and the bullet, crashed through the man's chest. As her victim sank to the floor Miss Perdue placed the revolver to his head and fired two bullets into his brain.

BEILISS FLEES FROM RUSSIA

Kiev, Russia, Nov. 15—Mendel Beiliss, whose trial on the charge of having caused the death of Andrew Yushinsky in a ritual murder, has stirred the world, is now in fear of re-arrest or assassinations because of the machinations of the anti-Semitic Black Hundred Society and today is hurriedly preparing to leave his native country for St. Paul, Minnesota, where a sister-in-law is living.

Beiliss, seen by a newspaper correspondent, declared that his life had been repeatedly threatened by members of the Black Hundred and fearing that even if the Russian police could protect him, his presence in Russia after the acquittal would result in new pogroms, or Jewish massacres, he would go into voluntary exile and endeavor in a new country to retrieve the terrible blow dealt him by his anti-Semitic enemies.

He pleaded with the interviewer not to reveal the plans for his secret departure from the scene of his tribulations, saying that his life would not be safe a moment, should the Black Hundred become cognizant of his route.

He added that several attempts had already been made upon him, and were only foiled by the vigilance of his Jewish friends. He accuses the Russian police of being secretly sympathetic with the Black Hundred and declares that he has little to hope from the police in the way of protection.

Beiliss declared that his only fear was that in emigrating to the United States emissaries of the Anti-Semites might trace his relatives there and in Russia and wreck their vengeance upon them, in anger at his escape from their clutches.

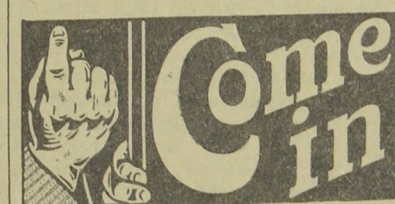
