Canadian Grape Fruit

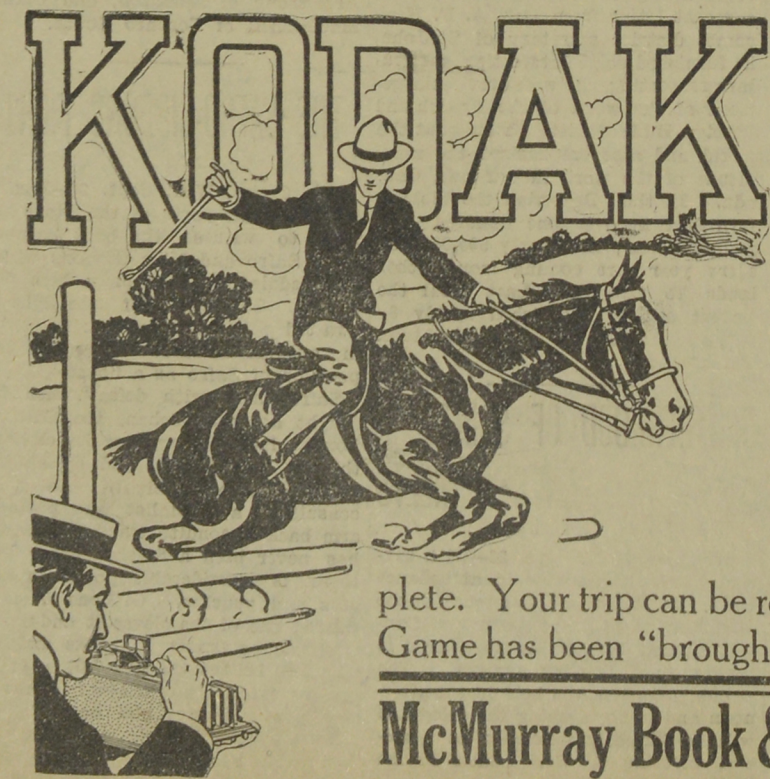
