the meaning of the elections act. The order of the court voiding the election was accompanied with the order that the respondent pay all the costs of the trial.

### CROSS PETITION DROPPED

A cross petition against R. L. Richardson was also formally dropped, A. J. Andrews, K. C., making the following statement to the court: "In the matter of the cross petition filed by Mr. Morrison against R. L. Richardson, the unsuccessful candidate in Macdonald, I am instructed that the same will not be prosecuted. I am pleased to state that a canvass of the situation failed to elicit any evidence of personal corruption on the part of Mr. Richardson, nor is there any evidence of any acts whatever of Mr. Richardson of any dishonorable character. The cross petition asking for disqualification of Mr. Richardson is therefore dropped." Mr. Morrison's majority was 784.

### STRONG CHARGES MADE

Winnipeg, Nov. 10—The petition against the return of Alex Morrison of Homewood as member of the Commons for Macdonald Man. charges that agents acting for Mr. Morrison "employed and set to work and gave instruction to certain Justices of the Peace, police constables, police officials, detectives, agents and other persons, to arrest and put in jail and keep confined therein persons whom they should discover in their said electoral district to be engaged in soliciting votes for or in advocating the candidature of R. L. Richardson," the Independent candidate.

It was charged that these court and police officials were paid for carrying out these instructions, and that they "falsely and maliciously, and without reason or probable cause, arrested or caused to be arrested on warrants issued in blank to them, and on other warrants corruptly and wickedly issued contrary to law, a number of persons who were found soliciting votes for and advocating the candidacy of R. L. Richardson."

### ALLEGED FALSE WARRANTS

It was maintained that these warrants were issued on false, fictitious, pretended and malicious charges. The arrest of these persons took away and destroyed the right of free discussion and free speech also the right to solicit votes for R. L. Richardson.

Another clause of the accusation declared that police constables, police officials, detectives and agents under instructions from the Roblin-Rogers-Campbell group pretended that they had power to arrest and would arrest any person who solicited votes for, or advocated the return of Mr. Richardson, that advocating his election constituted a criminal offence. By these means persons were frightened or intimidated from advocating the election of Mr. Richardson. They refrained from doing so, and also refrained from casting their votes at the election.

The petitioners in the case were Dr. Andrew Myles of Treherne and John E. Woods of Somerset. Their complaint also charged bribery, treating, personation and undue influence. The personal disqualifications of Mr. Morrison was asked for by the petitioners but the seat was not claimed for the Opposition candidate.

"There is a question in my mind as to whether I have a right to hand her over to Detective Hanrahan as no return of the habeas corpus has been made to me."

### MR. HUGHES' STATEMENT.

Mr. Hughes then stated that the girl was not held on any warrant and that he has a return of the habeas corpus from Deputy Sheriff Timmins.

His Honor said he could not accept such a return as there had been ample time for making such a return before and there also was the question as to whether or not Timmins had the girl in his custody.

Mr. Hughes—"He has now."

Mr. Hughes continued that the return showed that the girl was just staying at the jail and was not held on a warrant. Habeas corpus proceedings could be renewed from time to time and could be carried from judge to judges about the circuit as had been done in Ontario in a famous slave case.

### COULD NOT HAND HER OVER.

The Judge said that argument had been finished the day before. He felt that he could not hand the girl over to the person who formally had held her in view of the fact that he had not shown his authority for holding her.

Mr. Slipp asked that an order be given which would put the case in its original state.

"The dismissal of the order will produce that," replied His Honor.

### MR. SLIPP MAKES OFFER

Mr. Slipp then made an offer to Mr. Hughes to send the girl to Halifax accompanied by a relative or any other woman by publican or parlor car as might be desired guaranteeing the whole expense and that no effort would be made to take the girl away. He would be pleased to make such an arrangement with a note of Mr. Hughes' standing.

Mr. Hughes—"I would want to know if the girl would be prosecuted on the charge against her or if she would be wanted merely to give evidence against the Chinamen?"

Mr. Slipp—"I can promise that I would send a strong recommendation that there be no prosecution."

Mr. Hughes—"I cannot make such an arrangement with consultation."

His Honor later in the morning made an order dismissing the other order and Mr. Hughes then applied for a writ of habeas corpus returnable tomorrow at 11 a. m and the application was granted.

the campaign to arouse feeling against what they allege is an injustice to them, the committee will secure expert legal advice and prepare the way to obtaining a Government investigation into the situation.

Something of a sensation was precipitated when Chairman Cathers declared that Supreme Chief Ranger Stevenson offered to purchase the policies owned by the committee which interviewed him for \$100 each, or an equivalent of ten per cent. of the policy. "I object to that," declared Supreme Auditor Stewart. "I cannot credit Mr. Stevenson with making such an offer."

Mr. W. D. Watson, Secretary of the Executive Committee, read the list of questions placed before the Chief Ranger at a recent conference, together with the answers.

"We were told," said Mr. Watson, "that the revenue of the Temple Building is only two per cent of the actual cost, one of our assets built with pre-'99 members' money."

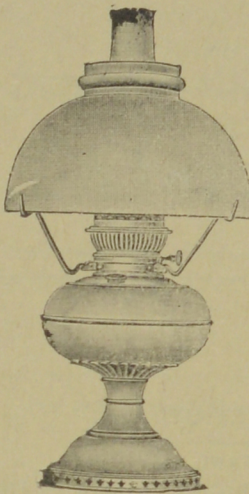

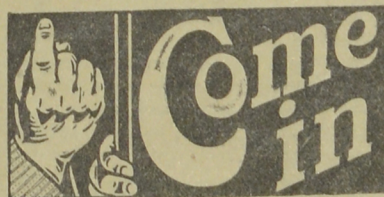
