

ORDER FOR RELEASE OF MISS LONG RECEIVED

WILL NOT LEAVE UNTIL
RETURN OF SHERIFF

Lieut. Governor Acted on Report of Dr. J. V. Anglin—Order Issued Tuesday.

An order has been made by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor for the discharge from custody of Miss Margaret Ann Long, who has been confined in the County Goal, after being cleared on an infanticide charge through the defence of temporary insanity. Miss Long was examined by Dr. J. V. Anglin of the Provincial Hospital and found to be sane some days ago, and at the request of the Attorney General he made a report to that effect. He judged her to be of sound mind. Following this examination on June 11th the report was presented to the Lieutenant Governor on June 14th and the order which has been received here was dated yesterday.

The militia of New Brunswick who are undergoing annual training in this city at the camp in Woodstock Road, are favored with magnificent summer weather. The syllabus has been followed with no omissions on account of unfavorable weather so far.

Musketry on Thursday.

Major F. A. Good who has charge of the musketry training for the camp is arranging for the use of the range at South Devon. The men of "A" and "B" Co's of the York Regiment will shoot tomorrow morning and part of the N.B. Dragoons in the afternoon. On Friday morning "C" and "D" co's of the York Regiment will fire over the range and in the afternoon of that day the remainder of the N. B. D. On Saturday morning the casuals who can be spared from other duties will have the use of the range, and thus practically all the men in camp will be given an opportunity of taking a course in this very important part of the soldier's training.

Brigadier a Visitor.

INCREASE IN POPULATION WILL BE SHOWN

EIGHTEEN ENUMERATORS
HAVE FINISHED WORK

Census in York-Sunbury Well
Advanced — Constituency
and City Have More
People in Them.

The census in the constituency of York-Sunbury is progressing well. Up to date eighteen of the forty-nine enumerators had completed their work and made their returns to A. E. Ashford in this city, census commissioner. None of the enumerators working in Fredericton have finished yet.

Increase Indicated.

An increase in the population of the two counties and also of the City of Fredericton is indicated. Estimates that Fredericton will have more than ten thousand people are thought to be over-sanguine and a population between nine and ten thousand is expected to be shown.

Students Not Counted.

Normal students and others who may be in this city attending educational institutions, are not included in the population of Fredericton special provision being made for their enumeration at their proper places of residence. Commercial travellers and others similarly situated are classed the same.

Summer Residents.

In like manner summer residents are credited to the places in which they have their permanent residence. Special forms to count them at both their permanent residences and their summer residences are issued.

Districts Completed.

Commissioner Ashford reports the following districts as having been completed recently:—Gladstone, Sheffield, Harvey Station, Meductic, Canterbury Station, Napudogan, Lower Southampton, Millville (one out of two enumerators), Tay Falls and Woodlands, Manguerville, Nortondale, Cork Settlement and Lower St. Mary's.

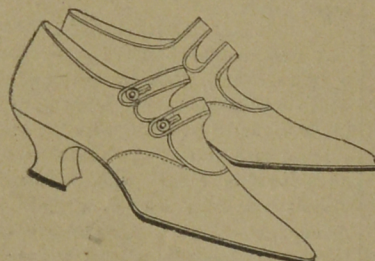
