permanent body and to hold annual sessions with the object of exchanging views on subjects of general importance, promoting greater uniformity in state legislation and attaining greater efficiency in the state administration.

Since the meeting in Washington in 1908 the conference has held sessions in Frankfort, Ky.; Trenton, N.J.; and Richmond, Va. The attendance has increased at each yearly session and at the same time the influence of the conference has broadened. As a safeguard to states' rights, the influence and importance of the conference can hardly be over-estimated. In the same way the conference has a tendency to curb any infringement on these rights by the federal government by bringing about the enactment of legislation in the various states that otherwise might receive the attention of congress. Heretofore it has seemed easier to amend the constitution and clothe congress with certain necessary power than to secure uniform legislation in the states. But the governors' conference it is believed, will ultimately be able to bring about uniform legislation on marriage and divorce, child labor, rates of interest, and numerous other social problems of pressing importance, thus lessening the tendency to expand the federal authority.

been operating a short distance up the line. His evidence was to the effect that he had gone to the doctors named and procured a prescription for liquor without specifying that it was for sickness.

The three doctors, whose cases came up today, went on the stand and said that they had given the prescriptions in good faith as the man claimed he was sick and at the time his appearance would lead them to believe that he was not well.

In the case of Dr. Pearson, the doctor said that he at first refused to give the prescription and while the man was on his way out he felt that he really needed the stimulant and called him back and gave the prescription.

C. H. Fairweather, Scott Act vendor for Kings county, told of supplying the liquor in each case.

Two cases against Dr. J. B. Gilchrist and one each against Drs. D. H. McAlister and J. H. Ryan are scheduled to come up tomorrow. It is said tonight that six reports have been made against a druggist of the town, who is reported to have made himself scarce and also a fruit dealer for selling liquor without a license. All but two of the doctors of the town are connected with these cases and it was brought out in evidence that these two were also approached but refused to give the order.

W. G. Asbell, Scott Act inspector for Kings county, is the informant in all cases. The affair has created a great deal of interest and some sensational developments are anticipated.
