MIGRATORY
BIRDS ACT

It is evident that quite a number of sportsmen not familiar with the text of the Migratory Birds' Act, which now takes in all feathered game, with the exception of partridge. Here are the features of the act pertaining to the Maritime Provinces, as taken from the last Canada Gazette:

Notwithstanding any provision of section 2 of these regulations, in the provinces of Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and British Columbia no person shall sell, expose for sale, offer for sale, buy, trade or traffic in any migratory game bird, killed or taken during the open season hereunder.

Section 9—Bag Limits

No person shall kill during any day, or during any season, migratory game

THE DISCARDED
HAT PROBLEM

New York, Sept. 21—Discarded hats constitute a real problem for New York hotels. Especially at such times as this, when the ending of a season automatically prompts people to throw away the head covering of that special season, thousands of hats are collected weekly in the big hotels. Then the problem is what to do with them. In one chain of hotels more than 3,000 hats were rounded up as the result of about ten days' work collected from rooms where they had been left in closets and drawers by departing patrons.

The crop of discarded headgear has been larger this year than ever before. In the case of this particular group of hotels the best of the hats were sorted out, men's and women's and bundled for shipment to Central Europe, where there is great need of any kind of wearing apparel. The rest of the cleanup went to John Junkman.

RED MAN WAS
IMPRISONED
UNDER CANOE

Gagetown, Sept. 20—What might easily have been a tragedy occurred on Thursday night when two local Indians, Jim Nash and his wife, narrowly escaped drowning in Gagetown creek from an overturned canoe. A yact, with a hunting party from the city on board, came to anchor at Gagetown on Thursday evening, and Jim and his wife paddled out to see if they needed the services of a guide. Mrs. Nash remained in the canoe while Jim went on board. Refreshments were provided by the hospitable yachting party, and when he and his wife started on the quarter mile stretch to their home, the canoe was pursuing a zig-zag course. While still in deep water, opposite the camps, the canoe upset and imprisoned Nash under it. He was finally able to extricate himself, but he and his wife clung to the canoe for nearly an hour until their despairing yells and the frightened cries of the Indians on the shore, brought to their rescue several men, including Sheriff Reid, who, on learning the cause of the near tragedy, reported the matter to Inspector Hawthorne, who immediately got after the yachtsmen, who later made an early exit from the town.

Black bellied and golden plovers and greater and lesser yellow legs—Fifteen in the aggregate of all kinds.

Wilson snipe or jack snipe—Twenty five.
