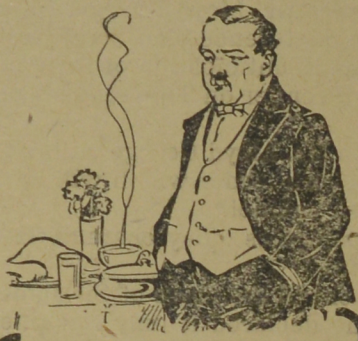

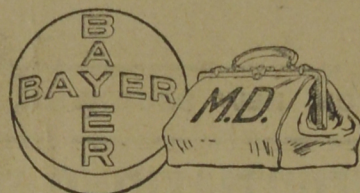

vincial organization—is appealing to the town and county councils, the boards of trade, commercial clubs, and public spirited citizens, from end to end of the province, to interest themselves in making these advantages for provincial and local improvement and beautification. One of the greatest necessities in many attractive localities would seem to be improved hotel and housing accommodations. At the late meeting of the Association in Sackville, it was decided to publish a provincial pamphlet setting forth the attractions and advantages of the Province as a summer camping ground as well as a permanent abiding place. On this point the Association secretary Mr. C. B. Allan of St. John would be pleased to receive suggestions and information as to the best routes, to be followed in reaching specially attractive areas the hotel or housing accommodation available, and such local resources or attractions as would prove most interesting. Our increase in the dollar membership is also desired, with a view to strengthening its influence and enabling it to carry on an extensive publicity propaganda covering all sections of the province.

The Association, since becoming provincialized has held meeting in St. John, Dalhousie and Sackville. Next season it is booked to meet in Edmundston, Madawaska, when it is hoped there will be a large representation from all parts of the province.

Our readers who are interested in promoting the welfare of the province are asked to lend their aid in building up this important provincial organization.
