THROUGH RAIL SERVICE ATLANTIC TO PACIFIC

Canadian National Railways Furnish Direct Connections with Famous "Continental Limited" Out of Montreal.

The finest train service to the Pacific Ocean is afforded by the Canadian National Grand Trunk "Continental Limited" now leaving at 9.00 p. m. daily from Bonaventure Station Montreal.

The route of this finely equipped all steel train to the coast is via Ottawa, North Bay, Cochrane and via the Transcontinental to Winnipeg and by Grand Trunk Pacific to Saskatoon and Edmonton and via Canadian National Railways to Vancouver—the finest of scenic routes through the Rockies and over the smoothest roadbed.

From Maritime Province points there is connection by Ocean Limited with the Continental Limited daily, and by the Maritime Express daily except Sunday. The Maritime arriving in Montreal at 7.40 affords the most direct connection, but passengers by the Ocean Limited will have the advantage of a day spent in Montreal. The Maritime arriving at Levis at 1.50 p. m., affords connection with train No. 11 leaving Quebec daily for Cochrane at 5.00 p. m. This train makes connection at Cochrane with the Continental Limited, so it will be seen there is really a choice of two distinct routes.

There is also the through service to the Pacific coast by train leaving Toronto daily at 10.30 p. m., via Sudbury, Port Arthur, Port William and Winnipeg. Connection for this is made by the Ocean Limited to Montreal, and the Grand Trunk International Limited to Toronto.

IMPS WON FROM WINTER PORT TEAM, 6 TO 3

At College Field last evening the Imperials came back strong and defeated the Commercial of St. John by a score of 6 to 3. One of the largest crowds of the season turned out to watch the game.

Although the game went only five innings there was plenty of excitement. The Imperials scored first in the first inning only to have it tied by the St. John team in the first of the third, but in the Imperials' part of that inning they netted five runs which was too big a lead for the visitors to overcome, although in the fourth the Commercial made a stab at victory and sent over two runs, bringing their total score to three. The game was called in the fifth on account of darkness.

Johnnie Bolster pitched for the Imperials, and was in good form. Evens started for the Commercial but gave way to Kirkpatrick in the third after four runs had been made off him.

The Commercial are scheduled to play at Marysville Saturday afternoon.
