Mexico City, Nov. 17.—El Imparcial today refers editorially to the organization of the Mexican congress, saying:

"It appears that this Mexican congress displeases the mighty personage of the White House, who takes us for slaves, whereas we belong to the noble and fierce race of Cuauhtemoc, the last Aetec sovereign of Mexico crossed with that other indomitable and proud people whose monuments of glory rear themselves on the heights of the Andes.

"Our grand president, now unembarrassed by intriguers, stands more firm than bronze.

"A people which loses its independence and dignity without a supreme effort is worse than dead and merits eternal ignominy."

walk through the valley of the Shadow of Death," by Sir Arthur Sullivan was sympathetically and beautifully rendered by the full choir, all of whom were dressed in black, as indeed were nine-tenths of the congregation.

Rev. Dr. Cowperthwaite preached from Isaiah 32:2: "The shadow of a great rock in a weary land." The general theme was the gospel of service, and the revelation of God, through man, as illustrated by the law of helpfulness. But it was the personal application that impressed and many a tear fell as Dr. Cowperthwaite spoke of the great and loving heart now silent in death. He had first met Dr. Rogers 43 years ago in Halifax. They had been young men together in the old conference of Eastern British America, of whose membership few remained today. On three circuits he had preceded or succeeded Dr. Rogers, who had been held in loving esteem by the people of every circuit in which he traveled. He was a cultured man, with an attractive personality, and all those qualities which go to make up the pulpit orator. But he was far more for it was the large and tender heart of the Christian gentleman, back of the minister, that drew the people to him and made his ministry a benediction. Staunch and true to the tenets of Methodism, his was the vision of the prophet as to the Catholicity of the Christian church. Never with him, did the trumpet give an uncertain sound. In Jabez Rogers the Lord had given to mankind a manly man at his best.

After the sermon and prayer, Mrs. F. J. King rendered, "I know that my Redeemer liveth" from Handel's Messiah. Newman's immortal hymn, "Lead Kindly Light" followed, after which with bowed heads the vast congregation listened to the solemn notes of the Dead March in Saul, so vividly, uninterrupted by Mr. King, from the distant whispering of sorrow to the final burst of triumphant melody. Then the congregation passed silently away.

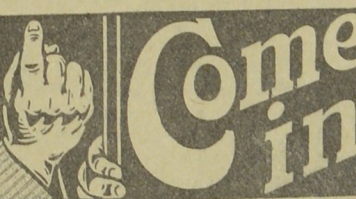
