

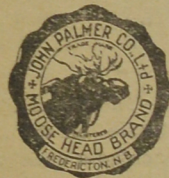

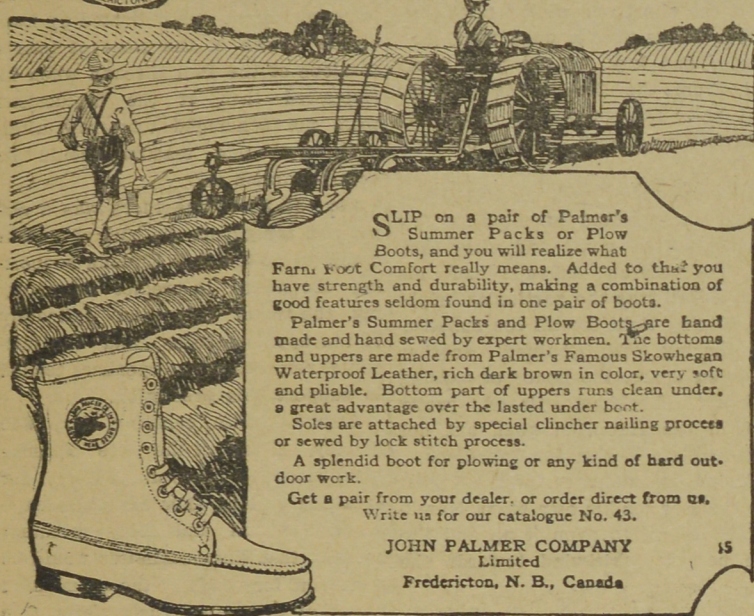

There were others in subsequent mails, but all were along the same lines and all of them began about as follows.

"Dear Miss Whoozis: May we not extend our heartiest congratulations to you in your great happiness? Have you thought of coming to Atlantic City for your honeymoon? We enclose rates as well as specimen menu from our luxurious dining room," or "Have you thought of buying your wedding cake from" and so forth.

The prospective bridegroom, too, of course, gets his share of the mail, but it is apparent by the difference in quantity between the two that the business seekers know that the best way to "approach" the swain is through his sweetheart.

## TRAVEL RUSH AT SEASON OF CHRISTMAS
