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### OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

#### FRILLS AND FURBELLOWS OF DAME MODE

A pretty frock is made with a green crepe underslip and sleeves, with a redingote of blue taffeta over it, buttoning in a little square extension over the waistline.

New slip-on blouses are made of heavy silk woven fabric, with bands around the bottom of heavy, thick wool embroidery.

A frock of English sateen, printed in small figures like old-fashioned tulle, is made with trimmings of white, bound with a narrow bias banding of the figured sateen.

The idea of outspreading wings on the head is a good one that finds expression in both hats and coiffure ornaments. Like Grecian victories, the young girls at a dance flaunt outspread wings of tulle and brilliants, of feathers and of metal work.

#### DRESS AT COWES

London, Aug. 30.—The yachting costumes worn by the women recently at Cowes were cut on severely plain lines, faultless in cut, fabric and detail. The materials favored were serge, gabardine, silk sponge cloth and Irish and Scotch homespuns, while the predominating colors were navy, white or cream.

The most popular type of coat was the reefer, cut single breasted with two hip pockets. The skirts were cut plain and sufficiently full to prevent tripping while on board the yachts. This type of costume will be favored for wear at Deauville, it is thought, and during the winter Riviera yachting season.

The etiquette of dress for the famous Cowes week was most punctiliously observed by the women in the court circle and the smart set. Many notable Americans who were on board their yachts anchored in the Roads or staying in the district, all favored this etiquette as strictly as the English women.

#### HINTS FOR THE LAUNDRY.

To whiten clothes that have become yellow, steep them over night in lukewarm water, and in the morning wash them in clean soap suds. Then put them in the boiler with cold water, some pieces of soap and a teaspoonful of powdered borax. Boil for 20 minutes, rinse immediately, and let them lie for another night in clean, cold water to which a little powdered borax has been added. You will find that this will remove all traces of yellow from the clothes.

When making hot starch, add a very teaspoonful of dry washing powder to a quart; this helps to prevent the irons from sticking when the things are being ironed.

Glycerin is excellent for removing tea or coffee stains from linen. Pour it over the stained part, rub it well in and wash in the usual way. The stains will quickly disappear.

When drying flannel garments, never hang them near a fire or they will certainly shrink. The best way is to hang them in a warm room away from the fire, or in a shady windy place outdoors.

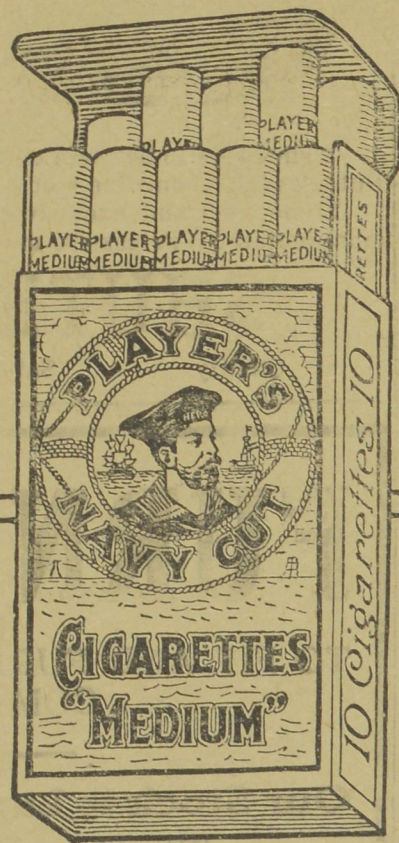
