D. F. Pidgeon—Put it (the I.C.R.) into the hands of a Maritime Province man and not an Upper Canadian who knows nothing of this territory, and put it under the jurisdiction of the railway commission.

STRONG RESOLUTION.

Moved by W. H. Barnaby and seconded by A. O. Skinner:

Whereas, the report of the delegation representing the City of Saint John in the matter of the withdrawal of the Empress steamships from this port has been made to this public meeting of the citizens of St. John by the president of the Board of Trade, Mr. J. M. Robinson, who has also informed the meeting that he has been advised by the Hon. J. D. Hazen that, while Mr. F. P. Gutelius had full authority to negotiate and make the agreement with the C.P.R., yet the formal contract must be submitted to and be approved by the minister of railways;

And whereas, this city has so far had nothing further than the statement of Sir Thomas Shaughnessy that the proposed traffic agreement is fair and just and such as would ordinarily entered into between private railways;

And whereas, the proposed arrangement appears to discriminate against the City of St. John and in favor of the City of Halifax to such an extent as to render it imperatively necessary that the rates provided by said agreement shall be reported upon by an independent traffic expert;

Therefore Resolved, That in justice to the port of St. John this meeting request the Hon. Frank Cochrane, minister of railways and canals, to withhold his sanction and approval from the proposed agreement until after an examination of the same shall have been made by an independent traffic expert of experts; and

Further Resolved, That in case upon such examination it shall be found that the rates proposed contain any sense discriminate against the interests of the port of St. John that such approval be absolutely refused; and

Further Resolved, That the government be also required to obtain such examination either by the traffic officers of the Railway Commission or by some other expert so independent as to command the confidence of this community; and

Further Resolved, That copies of this resolution be forwarded to Rt. Hon. R. L. Borden, Hon. J. D. Hazen and Hon. Frank Cochrane.

LIBERALS WILL PROTEST

A VICTORY FOR ROGERS' METHODS.

The Daily Telegraph, the official Liberal organ in Montreal, comments on the result as follows:

"The pleasantest course today would be to say that the electors of Chateaugay, having spoken, the verdict must be respected and to accept defeat with a good grace. The circumstances of the case, however, make this impossible. The defeat of Hon. Sydney Fisher will, of course, be claimed as a vindication of the Borden administration, a triumphant endorsement of the Conservatives' attitude on the big issues before the country and an indication that Sir Wilfrid Laurier's influence is waning. "As a matter of fact, it is nothing of the kind. The election is a triumph for something very different. It is a triumph for the Hon. Bob Rogers and his 'Manitoba methods,' a triumph for that kind of 'expert' manipulation of a constituency that characterized the MacDonald and Hochelaga elections. "For the first time in its history, the division has been made the camping ground of a certain class of election experts. We had the spectacle of the minister of public works on the spot but never once addressing the electors, instead he directed the operations of an army of hirelings whose duty it was to secure votes, not to present issues."

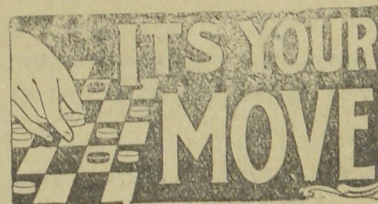
