Others elected include ex-Prem iers Baron Sidney Sonoino and Luigi Luzzatti, the ex-governor of Eryth rea, Ferdinado Martini, the Socialist leader; Signor Barzilai, and the form er minister of public instruction; Nun zio Nasi, who served a term in prison for embezzlement, and later was elec-Deputies, only to have his election
