

CHANGE IN BOUNDARY COMMISSION

Washington, D.C., Oct. 1.—The resignation of Frank S. Streeter of Concord, N.H., as one of the members of the International Joint Commission for the adjustment of boundary disputes between the United States and Canada became effective today. Mr. Streeter's place on the commission was taken by Mr. Obadiah Gardner, formerly United States senator from Maine. A salary of \$10,000 a year is connected with the position.

DR. OSLER ON DRUGS

Eminent Canadian Doctor Not a Great Medicine Giver

Dr. (Sir) William Osler is probably the greatest living authority on the use of drugs in the treatment of disease. At one time a professor in John Hopkins University, Dr. Osler was appointed Regius Professor of Medicine at Oxford University, England, and he is regarded by the doctors of every English-speaking country as a great authority.

Dr. Osler says of diphtheria: "We are still without drugs which can directly counteract the toxins of the disease, and we must rely upon general measures of feeding and stimulants to support the strength. Medicines given internally are of little avail in diphtheria."

Concerning pneumonia, Dr. Osler says:

"Pneumonia is a self-limited disease which can neither be cut short nor aborted by any known means at our command. Even under the most unfavorable circumstances it may terminate abruptly and naturally without a dose of medicine having been administered. There is no specific treatment of pneumonia. The young practitioner may bear in mind that patients are more often damaged than helped by the too promiscuous system of drugging, which is still only too prevalent."

Of scarlet fever, Dr. Osler says: "Ordinary cases do not require any medicine. Medical antipyretics are not of much service in comparison with cold water."

Of measles, Dr. Osler says: "Confinement in bed in a well ventilated room and light diet are the only measures necessary in uncomplicated cases."

Of whooping cough, Dr. Osler says: "The medical treatment is most unsatisfactory."

Of yellow fever: "Careful nursing and a systematic plan of diet probably give the best results."

Of dysentery: "The treatment of dysentery by topical applications is by far the more rational plan."

Sheepskins in Gas Meters

It will undoubtedly surprise many to learn that sheepskin plays an important part in the construction and operation of the gas meter. This leather is used to form the "diaphragms" or two bellows from which gas is drawn when a jet is lighted. They are fastened between two circular pieces of metal, acting precisely as the diaphragm in the human body. When gas is drawn from one, the other is refilled, so the consumer is given an even and constant supply.

THE SPAN OF LIFE SHOWN BY FIGURES

For Those Under Thirty the Expectation of Longevity Has Increased—Married People Fortunate

How long do you expect to live? Perhaps you have never given the matter a thought. The majority of people simply want to live as long as they can—and let it go at that. Therefore maybe it would be better to ask: How long can you expect to live?

Suppose you are between 40 and 45 years of age. If that is the case you may expect to live 23.4 years more—if you happen to live in a city. The matter of where you live changes the figure slightly but not much.

It occurred to the health department of one city to prepare a table of the expectation of life among the inhabitants of its city, in the hope that the people would help fight disease and so prolong their calculated allowed span.

The preparation of a table of this sort is a very complicated proceeding that requires an expert. But the results obtained are highly valuable. The figures are practically the same for all sections of the country. These show that there has been an increase in the expectation of life, as it is called, from the age of 1 year to the age of 30 and a decrease from 30 years on. For instance, a child 5 years old might expect to live 52 years more. That is an increase of 11 years over the expectation of life calculated a third of a century ago. An adult between 25 and 30 years of age has 32.6 years more to live, according to this table, while a person 85 years old may reasonably expect to live only 3 years and 3 months longer.

The expectation of life for men and women is different, for people in different trades it is different. These differences bring to light some curious facts. For instance comparison of the sexes instead of ages shows that women in general have about 6 years longer to live than men. The figures also show that married men live longer than single men and that married women live longer than single women. The Jew lives longer than the Gentile by a round dozen years. The negro appears to have less chance of life than the white man.

But throughout it is found that the span of life for people up to the age of 30 has increased during the last 30 years while that for people beyond the age of 30 has decreased.

Butterfly's Long Trip

Brilliantly colored butterflies or moths, three inches in length and brightly hued, are not common in Canada, and consequently some workmen in a Toronto lumber yard were surprised to see one of this kind fluttering around in a car. It was in with some ash lumber, which arrived from the Southern States, so that evidently it had traveled the distance from its native clime in a box car. It was three inches long and measured three and a half inches from tip to tip of the wings. The body was two and a half inches long and the wings were striped with grey, yellow, black and white.

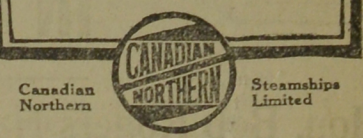

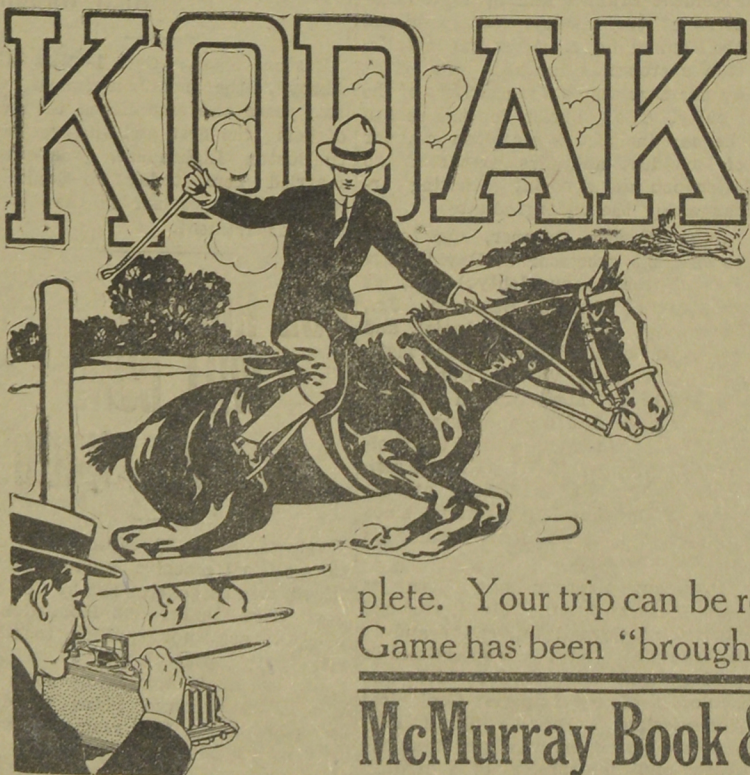
