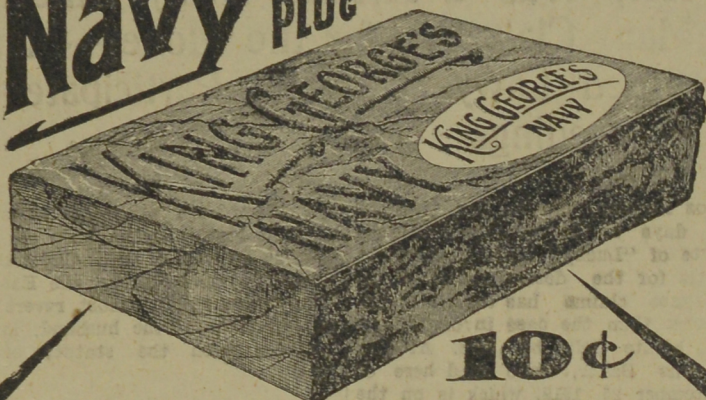

#### First Hospital in 370

Hospitals were originally hospitia for the reception of travelers. Among the earliest hospital were the one founded by Valens in Caesarea in 370, and that built at Rome in the time of St. Jerome. The earliest date of a hospital in England is 1080, when Lanfranc, Archbishop of Canterbury, founded two, one for leprosy and one for ordinary diseases.

One at Jerusalem, built by the Knights of St. John in 1112, had accommodations for 2,000 inmates, with an infirmary. Of the first of English hospitals was St. Bartholomew's. It was built as a priory in 1102; handed over to the citizens of London in 1547, and rebuilt in 1729.

Bethlehem, of Bedlam, a priory built in 1247, was given to King Henry VIII. for the reception of the insane. This is the oldest hospital for the insane in Europe, with the exception of the one in Granada.

#### Arctic Fur Harvest

Captain Bernier, the Arctic explorer, stated, after a trip to Baffin Land that he was absolutely convinced that Canada has an inexhaustible harvest of furs and other commercial commodities along her northern boundaries.

"I brought back with me," he said, "a full cargo of furs, ivory, fish and oil. There is a harvest up there that Canada of the future will be glad of, for it is boundless. Of the furs I brought back, the foxes, blue and white, are the best, but there are some very fine bearskins and seal."
