The Tory party is strong on organizers in New Brunswick. There is Organizer W. B. Dickson, M.P.P., who travels about at the public expense and turns up in Fredericton every time there is a government meeting. He has no visible means of support and was given the job to help him out of a very deep hole. It appears that Mr. Dickson was not able to cover the field to the satisfaction of the Tory bosses and Mr. Harry Woods now bobs up in the capacity of an organizer.

Premier Borden, in a speech at Halifax a few days ago, revamped the old Tory slander that Sir Wilfrid Laurier is the foe of imperial connection. This style of political warfare is to be expected from Tory hack organs which draw thousands of dollars from the public treasury but it is scarcely becoming to a man holding the high office of prime minister of Canada. Mr. Borden has on more than one occasion proved himself too small for the position he holds.

Mr. Harry Woods, who holds the office of government whip in the Legislature, has been appointed federal Tory organizer for New Brunswick. Mr. Woods was promised a better job but Hon. Mr. Hazen, it seems, had promised it to one or two others and was unable to deliver the goods. Mr. Woods, therefore, who is a Tory of Tories, reluctantly consented to be let down with the job of provincial organizer.

Last year the Postmaster General wiped the name of "Graham" off the post-office map. The name was given in compliment to the then Minister of Railways to the junction point of the National Transcontinental and the G. T. P. branch to Fort William. Mr. Pelletier for obvious reasons didn't like the name and had it changed. Once upon a time Mr. Pelletier dismissed a Grit postmaster who had been dead several years.

When it comes to holding successful exhibitions, Fredericton is right there with the goods. We have already passed the thirty thousand mark this time. No other city in Canada with eight thousand population, can do the trick.

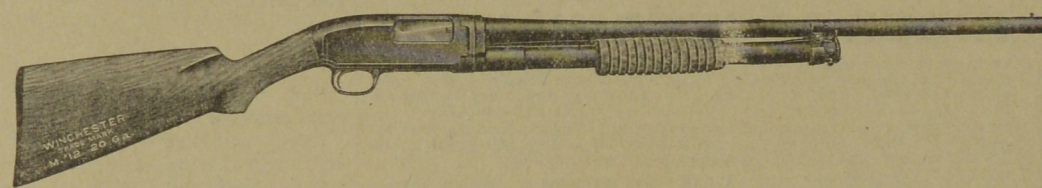

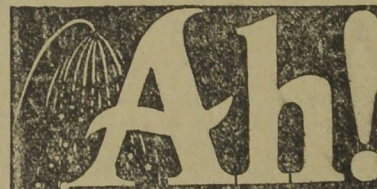
