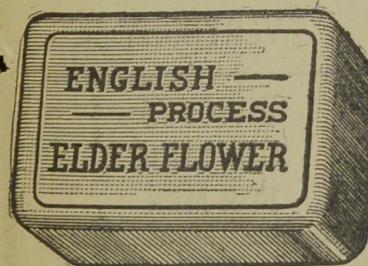

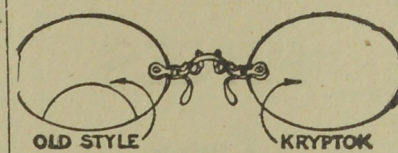

HONORED THE MEMORY OF A GREAT STATESMAN

Birthplace of Daniel Webster at Franklin
N. H. Has Been Restored and Was
Dedicated Today in the Presence of
Thousands of People--Patriotic Ora-
tions Delivered

Franklin, N. H., Aug. 28—Several
thousand citizens of this state and
hundreds of prominent visitors from
other states attended the patriotic
exercises held here today to celebrate
the completion and dedication of the
Webster Memorial House, which is
really the restored birthplace of
Daniel Webster. The exercises were
held at the old Webster house and
consisted mainly in the delivery of a
number of historical and patriotic
speeches by distinguished orators
from this and other states, honoring
the memory of Daniel Webster and
expressing satisfaction over the pre-
servation and restoration of the
great statesman's birthplace.

When Daniel Webster was born on
January 18, 1782, the humble house
in which he first saw the light of day
was in Salisbury, now a part of
Franklin. When Franklin became a
town, in 1828, it took parts of Sal-
isbury, Northfield, Andover and San-
bornton into its territory. Tradition
says that when Daniel Webster was
born the clearing around his father's
cabin was the furthest north in New
Hampshire. There was only a bridge
path to the place and the house was
located so as to face an old mill in
the hollow. Trees that have stood
for centuries are still there, but
nothing remains of the old mill but
the dam. When Daniel Webster was
three years of age, his father, Capt.
Ezekiel Webster, moved to what is
known as the Elm Farm at Webster
Place. This is now a part of the
New Hampshire Orphans' Home, the
exterior and interior having been
preserved intact. Abigail Chapter,
D.A.R., has had installed in front of
the house a boulder with a bronze
marker. The birthplace and the Elms
are the only two places now standing
in Franklin in which Daniel Webster
lived. The old Webster tavern, across
the street from the Elms, which was
once his home, has been removed, to
give way to a more modern farm-
house.

After Webster's father had moved
to the Elms, the old house which the
family had formerly occupied was

moved across the road and attached
to a big two-story farmhouse as an
ell. The cellar of the old house was
filled in and the location was forgot-
ten. In October, 1910, at a meeting
in the office of Chief Justice Frank
N. Parsons of the New Hampshire
Supreme Court, in this city, the Web-
ster Birthplace Association was or-
ganized. The organization obtained
an appropriation of \$1500 from the
legislature and this, with other vol-
untary contributions, enabled the
association to purchase the site of
Webster's birthplace and to restore
the house nearly to its original ap-
pearance. The house was moved back
and placed upon its original founda-
tion, which was fortunately found.
The old fire-place in the kitchen or
living room, with its big iron crane,
was rebuilt and the house itself re-
stored to its original state inside
and outside as much as possible.
Even the old well in the yard was
restored, together with its old-fash-
ioned sweep and oaken bucket. Funds
will be collected to make it possible
to install a caretaker and to keep the
house in good condition.

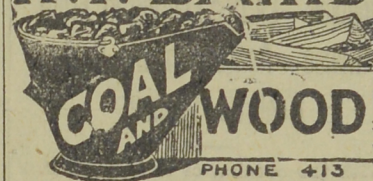
