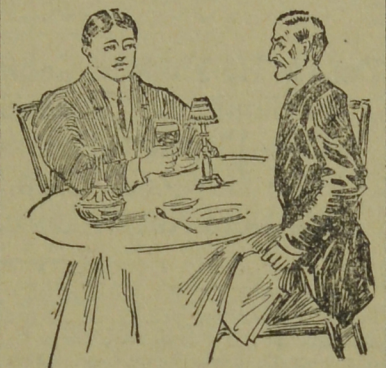

and accepted employment in the railway service in Massachusetts. Returning to Canada in 1900, he entered the service of the C.P.R. and came west in that company's employ as traveling auditor with headquarters at Winnipeg and Calgary. In 1905 he resigned his position with the C.P.R. and removed to Saskatoon, where he was active in the development of that ambitious and quickly growing centre, which had practically only been put on the map two years previously. When Saskatoon was incorporated in 1906 he was elected one of its first aldermen, also serving as chairman of its health and relief committee.

A PROMINENT MASON.

Mr. Coy has always taken a prominent part in Masonic circles. He was director of the Saskatoon Masonic Temple Committee, past principal of the Royal Lodge Chapter, past presiding preceptor in the Knights Templar Order. He is also a Scottish Rite Mason and a Shriner.

Speaking of his accepting the honorary colonelcy of the Gordon Highlanders, Mr. Coy stated yesterday that as a newcomer he had naturally felt a reluctance to come forward to undertake a position which might have been better filled by an older and more widely known Victoria resident, but so strong are his sympathies with the voluntary services of the Dominion and so impressed with the important part they will play in the future of the country, both as a means of defence against outside foes and also as an excellent training ground for the young men of the nation, that when the chance was offered him of taking part in the establishment of a Highland regiment here he gladly accepted the post offered him."

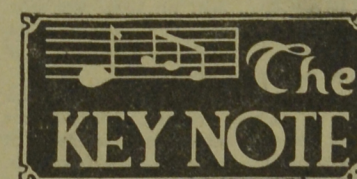
