IMPROVEMENT IN  
RATIONS OF MILITIA  
TO BE MADE

Experiments With New Ration-System  
Made in Cadet Camps This Year  
---Reported to Have Been  
Satisfactory

An improvement in the rations to be issued the militiamen training in the various camps of instruction throughout Canada is contemplated by the Militia Department and it is probable that the camps of 1914 will see a new ration-scale and system in operation. The improvements have been tested at the cadet camps and it is understood that they have been reported to be very satisfactory.

An experiment was made at the cadet camp, which closed at Sussex on Tuesday last and the new ration-system is said to have made a big hit with the cadets. The main points of the new ration-scale is a reduction of the quantity of meat issued and the substitution of other articles of diet. Oatmeal alternated with bacon for breakfast at the recent cadet camp and vegetables and evaporated fruit took the place of a certain proportion of the meat-ration. Condensed milk was also issued and takes the place of ordinary milk which formerly was obtained from farmers living near the camp. Under the new system milk is not to be allowed to be bought at the camps, the ration of condensed milk taking its place.

The most marked improvement in militia rations was made about ten years ago when Sir Frederick Borden was minister of militia at the suggestion of (Continued on page four.)

SETTLEMENT TO  
NEW BRUNSWICK

Medical Superintendent of Lunatic  
Asylum at Singapore Wishes to  
Buy Fruit-lands Near This City  
---After Information

Publicity Commissioner G. M. McDade is in receipt of a letter from a medical doctor of Singapore, Straits Settlement, in the Malay Peninsula, which shows that the publicity campaign undertaken a couple of years ago by the city and Board of Trade is bearing fruit. The writer states that he wishes to settle in a British country within easy reach of the Old Land and that it is his intention to purchase fruit-lands. He seeks fullest information concerning the price of land, buildings, building-material, labor, etc. This will be given him by the Publicity Department.

The inquirer is medical superintendent of the lunatic asylum at Singapore and is about to retire after thirty-one years' service. He is in his fifty-first year and receives on an annual allowance of £400. His wife and family will accompany him to the new home. His eldest son at present is attending grammar school at Bedford, England. His people are living in Sussex and Kent, England, and it is to be within easy reach of them that he favors this province for a new home.

The fame of the St. John Valley as a fruit-growing district is fast becoming known in distant lands and a great development in fruit-growing is expected in this section within the next few years.
