NEED CLOSE TIME TO SAVE MOOSE

(Bangor News)

Walter H. Neal, member of the Maine fish and game commission, expressed the belief that in order to save the moose of Maine from the legislature to pass a law establishing a close time of four or five years on bulls. Cow moose are now and have for some years been protected at all seasons. While it is lawful to kill one bull more than one year old in the month of November. The result of this arrangement is that while the woods are full of barren cow moose, the bulls are not only few, but for the most part too young to be effective in propagation. Commissioner Neal believes that a close time is necessary in order to give the young bulls an opportunity to get their full growth.

Commissioner Neal also is of the opinion that the alarming number of fatal accidents in the game season might be lessened if a law were passed protecting doe deer, and limiting legal game to bucks, the idea being that the sight of the buck's horns will enable hunters to positively identify the object fired at as a deer. A two years close time on does, he thinks, would demonstrate the value of this precaution.

Commissioner Neal advocates the imposition of a license tax of one dollar on residents, and the prohibition of boys under sixteen hunting at all unless accompanied by parent, guardian, or some person holding a license. He points out that with residents, as well as non-residents, licensed, it would be easy for the wardens to distinguish one from the other and thus prevent fraud in the matter of license fees; also, as the licenses would be obliged to make returns of the game killed, it would thus be easy to ascertain closely the number of deer and moose actually killed in the state. Bills covering these subjects will probably be introduced in the next legislature.

Here are some "Safety First" maxims given out by Mr. N. S. Dunlop to a meeting of railway men at an address in Montreal:

"Don't throw anything out of a moving train. It's a bad thing to get a mail bag in the stomach from an express running thirty miles an hour. A brakeman should not 'it down' on the track and be run over by the train he went to flag."

"It takes less time to prevent an accident than it does to fill up Form 74 (the accident report form)."

"Don't fool with machines. They can be replaced. Hands cannot."

"You can start a 'Safety First' committee right in your own home."

"Get the 'Safety First' Habit."

"Stop supporting the undertaker and the artificial limb maker."

"No mail should go twenty-four hours without placing his insurance."

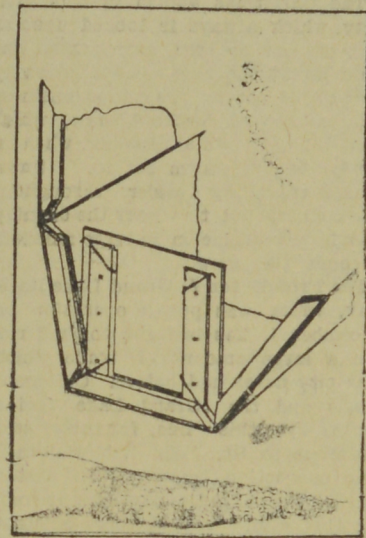
Mr. Dunlop is an enthusiast for "Safety First," a movement which was started on the C.P.R. so long ago as 1885.

KNOCKDOWN SHIPPING BOX

Six Pieces Quickly Formed Into Strong Close Case

An ingenious form of shipping box is shown here. It is in knockdown style and not only makes a strong case, with close-fitting joints, but can be used over and over again. There are four side pieces and two end pieces. Each side piece has groove cleats on each end and the end piece

fit between the side cleats. Two cleats secured to each end piece have flanges that engage the grooves of the adjacent cleats on the sides. These various pieces register so neatly that merchandise of small articles can be carried in the box without tilting through. Wires hold the box shut and when it has been emptied it can be taken apart and shipped back flat if the consignor wants it.
