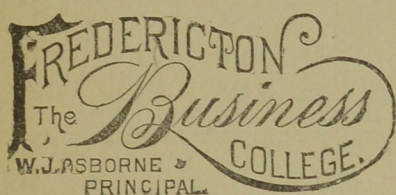

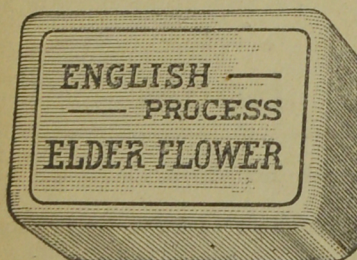

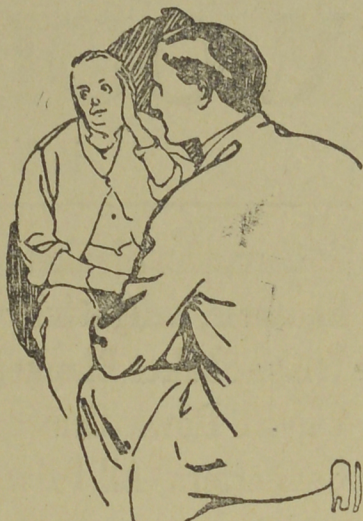
The Riverman

"I just guessed."

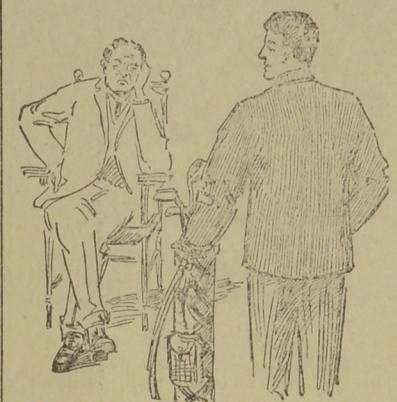
"Well, it was Newman. He tied up the land in this trumped up investigation so you could not borrow on it."

were under construction. One was from Gagetown to Fredericton; one from Fredericton to Woodstock, and one from Woodstock to Centreville. The three comprise a distance of about 120 miles. The grading had been completed for the greater portion of this distance and on sixty miles the steel is down.

"The company has until November, 1915, in which to complete the steel laying on these three sections and to grade and lay the steel on the two remaining sections—that from St. John to Gagetown and from Centreville to Grand Falls. The combined length of these two stretches is about eighty miles. We expect the company to complete the work according to program."

"When will the bridges across the St. John River and the Kennebecas River be commenced?"

"That depends somewhat upon the company. As far as the bridges are concerned, we expect to see the agreement we have entered into carried out. I do not think I could speak more definitely than this."
