FREDERICTON EXHIBITION

J. W. McCREADY.

City Clerk J. W. McCreedy was then introduced by Mr. Dibblee and welcomed the visitors on behalf of the City of Fredericton.

The Fredericton Exhibition he said, was known from Atlantic to Pacific as an educative show. It had been in existence for fifty years and had become a permanent factor in the life of New Brunswick. As Hon. Mr. Morrissey had remarked, the show always had been able to pay its way and with favorable weather could do it again. The City of Fredericton was developing. It was becoming the "hub" of New Brunswick. A few years ago people could come to Fredericton by three railroads, now they could come by four as well as by the great river. By the time the next fair should come around two more railways would be available as means of reaching the city.

This brought the opening proceedings to a close.

EARL VISITS FAIR.

The Earl of Kingston of Kilomas Castle, Ireland, who is here on a hunting trip, visited the fair yesterday afternoon in company with a representative of The Mail. He was shown over the building and the grounds and was much interested in all he saw, particularly the display of fruit which he pronounced very fine. The Earl is the owner of an estate of eighteen thousand acres in Ireland and prides himself on being some farmer. "A cracking good show" was the way in which he described the exhibition.

BOARD OF TRADE EXCURSION.

The St. John Times of last evening says:

A Board of Trade excursion by train to the Fredericton exhibition will be held on Wednesday morning at nine o'clock. This was decided upon at a meeting of the council of the board at noon today. The action was decided upon as a recognition of the co-operation the local board has received from Fredericton in various times past and as an evidence of their interest in Fredericton affairs.

GOOD ATTENDANCE.

The turnstiles last night showed a total paid attendance of 1,438. The only other six-day show was in 1903 when the attendance upon the opening night was 1,273, leaving a small balance in favor of the present exhibition. The weather today is magnificent and with many people in the city it is expected that the attendance will show a marked increase.

EXCURSION TODAY.

Today, a large excursion party was brought to the city by the Canadian Pacific Railway from Northern New Brunswick and Aroostook County. The special train arrived at noon. It included eight cars and brought about five hundred people. Tomorrow is St. John Day at the fair with a special excursion from the Winterport.

HE FELL FOR IT.

There was great joy and excitement at the Diving Girl show last night when a newcomer fell for the old "drowning gag" and leaped into the tank to rescue one of the performers who had made a successful bluff at falling in. The would-be rescuer was rather astonished a moment after performing the brave deed to see the woman he had rescued turning somersaults off the spring-board into the tank. He was presented with a leather watch-fob by the management of the show as a token of appreciation.

JUDGING BEGINS.

Judging of cattle began this morning and up to noon progress in the Holstein Class had been made as far as Junior Calves. The Herds followed early this afternoon. Among the successful exhibitors in this class were Lea & Clark of Victoria, P.E.I., Harding Bros. of Welsford, N.B., and C. H. Giles of Springhill.
