## Track Record Lowered To 2.13 1-4 By Dingola

Blind Halifax Stallion Broke Record in First Heat of 2.18 Pace and 2.15 Trot and Tied it in Second ---Exhibition Meet Opened With Some Great Racing---Another New Record Possible Today---James K. Newbro Beat Dingola Out in Faster Class---Dan Paine Won 2.30 Pace and 2.27 Trot ---Lucky Baldwin in Peculiar Accident---Track Was Fast Yesterday

The Fredericton race-track now has a new record and there is a prospect of another new record being made before this afternoon's racing is finished. Dingola, the blind Halifax stallion, owned by J. B. Mitchell, made the new mark, clipping half a second off the record of 2:13 1/4 made by the free-for-all, Aleyde, entered by Watman of Providence, R.I., last year. Dingola made the track record 2:13 1/4 in the first heat of the 2:18 pace and 2:15 trot, the local horse, James K. Newbro, pressing him to the wire. In the second heat Thomas S gave him a close race and he tied the record made in the first heat. It is not often that one race sees the track record smashed and then tied. Although the Halifax stallion went two so fine heats the race went to James K. Newbro with the old favorite, Thomas Raymond, driving Dingola acting badly in the last three heats and the Fredericton horse taking advantage of that.

### PECULIAR ACCIDENT.

The other race was the 2:30 pace and 2:27 trot, which also required five heats to decide. Lucky Baldwin, a Bangor horse, won two good heats but after having a mishap early in the third heat went bad. Dan Paine driven by Peter Carroll and entered by Pat Doherty of Sydney, won the race easily beating Lucky Baldwin in three heats. The other two horses entered were distanced in the second heat.

The accident to Lucky Baldwin in the third heat was caused as far as could be learned by a rein getting caught in a wheel of the sulky, and the horse was thrown almost of his feet. Driver Jackson held him up, giving a fine exhibition of skill. Luckily for horse and driver, there were no other horses behind. After the accident Lucky Baldwin did not seem to have the necessary fight in him and the race went to Dan Paine.

### THE FAST CLASS.

There was racing from start to finish of the 2:18 pace and 2:15 trot. The condition of the track lent itself to fast racing, having dried out well after Saturday's rain and having the brush put over it frequently. Dingola was in good trim for two heats and beat out James K. Newbro and Thomas S respectively in first and second heats in the fast time of 2:12 1/4 each

time. In the third heat Raymond drove the Newbro horse to win. Dingola made a bad break on the last quarter and finished third. The remaining heats were largely repetitions of that, Dingola making bad breaks late in the mile. In the fifth he gave James K. Newbro a hard race until the last quarter. Ora Delmarch showed good speed in this race but was not in the best of condition. He was withdrawn after the third heat.

### DAN PAINE'S WIN.

The 2:27 pace and 2:24 trot presented features similar to those of the faster class. Lucky Baldwin went two heats. Tommy Cotter was second in the first but with Ada Todd got the flag in the second when Dan Paine was second. After that there was nothing to it. As mentioned before the Bangor horse met with a mishap in the third heat which took all the scrap out of him. In the other heats when he stopped fighting he switched his tail as a signal that that he was done.

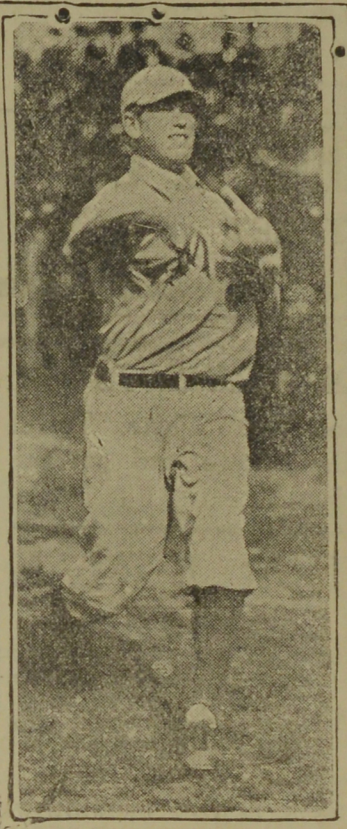

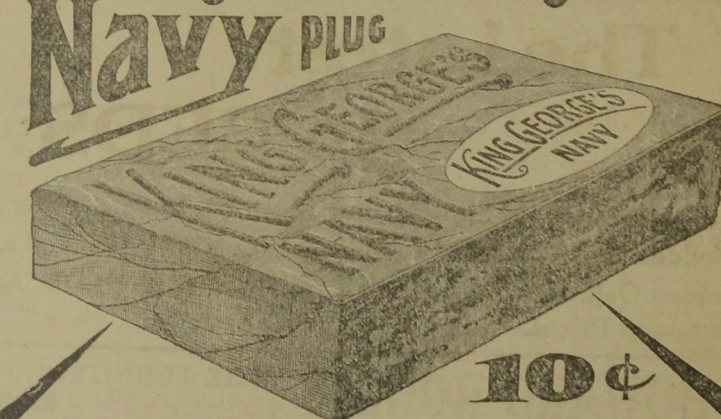

## BRILLIANT RACES ON GRAND CIRCUIT AT DETROIT

Directum I Made His Western Debut and Won Easily---Marta Bellini Beaten in 2.20

Detroit, Mich., Sept. 15—Large fields, close finishes and two brilliant victories of horses driven by Andrews marked the opening today of a five-day Grand Circuit harness meeting, here, in connection with the State Fair. No records were broken but fast time was made in several heats and in the 2:09 trot thirteen horses, the largest grand circuit field of the season faced the starter.

As expected, Directum I, making his debut on a western track, romped away with the 2:05 pace.

Marta Bellini, favorite, was beaten in the 2:20 trot. The brown mare took the first heat and in the second she was leading on the stretch when she broke. Westerville Girl, driven by Andrews, passed her and then took the succeeding heats.

The 2:16 pace was rather monotonous. It was a procession for Del Ray and Margot Hal, they finishing first and second respectively in each heat. Andrews twice guided New Zell to victory in the 2:09 trot.
