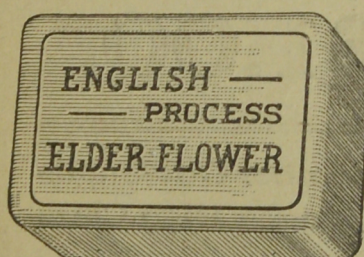

flown.

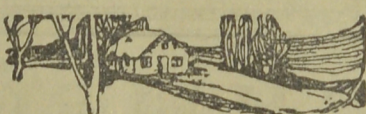
"We must pack up, sweetheart," said
