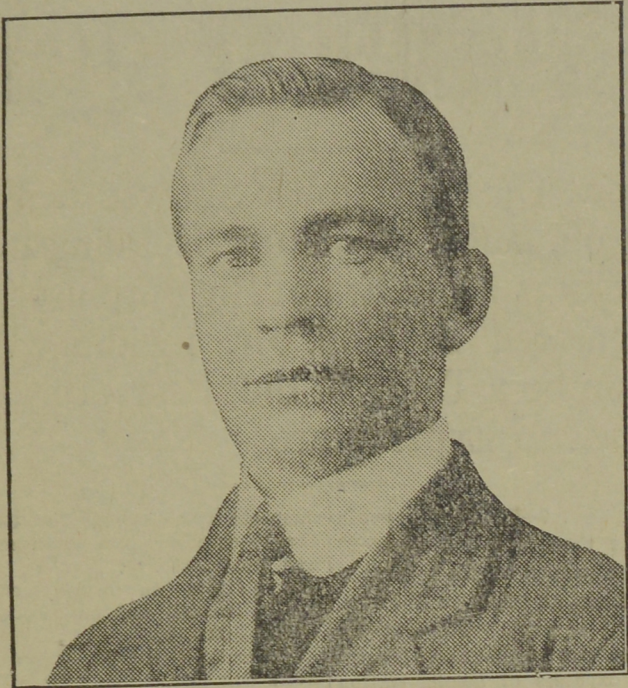

## MEXICAN FRUITS

Many Fruits Unknown to Most of Us  
Grow Wild There

Mexico is the fruit paradise. Fruits never heard of by the hundreds of millions who live in the temperate zones grow there in profusion, and Acapulco, on the Pacific slope, is perhaps the garden spot of it all. It is noted for the great quantity of indigenous varieties which grow spontaneously. No effort has been made towards extensive cultivation by the natives, much to the surprise of visitors from the North. With the exception of some indifferent cultivation of coconuts and bananas everything else grows wild and in luxuriance.

Of the fruits known in the United States this district alone produces bananas, oranges, pineapples, mangoes, limes and lemons. And here are a few more of other varieties never seen above the border line: toronjas, a species of grapefruit, the aguacate, papaya, guayabo, chico, zapote, mamey, llama, anone, granada, caimita, cartajena, meson, wanuche, jicame, tamarindo, nanche, huleon, icacos, almendra (almond), ciruela (plum), and undoubtedly many others.

But so indifferent are the natives to their possibilities that nothing is exported except the lime and its products.

## GIANT FLAGSTAFF

Vancouver Has the Tallest Flagstaff in the British Empire

Towering 218 feet in the air and weighing eleven tons, the largest one-piece flagstaff in the British Empire is to be seen in front of the magnificent courthouse at Vancouver. The big stick is a product of the British Columbian forests, and is a flawless example of British Columbian timber. At its base the flagstaff is three feet square, and at the top it is a foot in diameter. The big gilt ball at the top measures twelve feet in circumference, while the big arrow which shows plaintiffs and defendants alike which way the wind is blowing at the courthouse measures fifteen feet from end to end.

The giant flagstaff is held in place by guy cables set in concrete beds at each corner of the courthouse lawn, and will stand for many decades as an example of what the forests of British Columbia can produce in the way of tall timber.

## Keeping Tab on Railwaymen

The "Brown system of discipline" will be introduced on the Intercolonial Railroad of Canada. By this system merit marks and demerit marks will be kept for each employee. When the number of demerit marks exceed the number of merit marks by 60 the employee will be discharged from the road.

## HOLLAND PLANNING BIG UNDERTAKING

Amsterdam, Nov. 6.—The Government Commission appointed several years ago to investigate the feasibility, probable cost and other matters relating to the proposition of reclaiming the land at present covered by the Zuiderzee, a large body of water connected with the sea and covering about 200,000 hectares, has just submitted an interesting and voluminous report, thoroughly covering every phase and detail of the stupendous plan. It appears that the fisheries in the waters of the Zuiderzee, once famous for the enormous quantities of herrings and other salt fish caught there, have not been very profitable in recent years. It is estimated that the total value of the fish caught in the Zuiderzee does not now exceed 2,000,000 florins a year, while by the cultivation of the reclaimed land now covered by salt water 70,000,000 florins a year could be realized. The commission estimates that the cost of the work, including indemnities, etc., would not exceed 189 million florins and that the work could be completed in about thirty years.

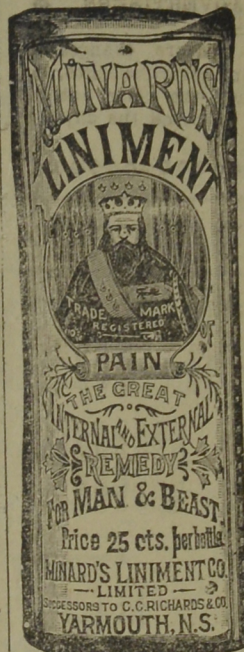
