

weight of the second and third stor ies being carried by steel beams. The interior fittings of this floor are of quartered oak and the bank fixtures of fumed oak who base of pink Tennessean marble and etched glas

The main banking-room is lighted by the indirect system, the electric lights being on the ceiling in fixtures of bronze and ground glass. The floor is covered with heavy cork linoleum and the walls, as on the econd floor, are of rock plaster. The ceiling and walls are ornamented with plaster cornice. The vestibule has a marble floor and ornamental plaster plasters and cornice. All the toilets are equipped with marble floors and basins. The vault on the ground floor is of reinforced concrete and contains a large number of safety-deposit boxes. The dimensions of the vault are 8 by 14 by 10 feeb.
