MURDER TRIAL

at the times and localities designated by him. Later Spencer recalled his alleged confessions but the authorities are of the opinion that Spencer, although some of the alleged crimes were probably only figments of a drug-crazed imagination, really did commit some of the other crimes which he confessed.

When Spencer was arraigned before Judge Slusser of the Du Page County Court he was not represented by a lawyer. He refused to plead not guilty and demanded that he be tried on the spot and sentenced to death. He refused to employ counsel and became greatly excited when Judge Slusser appointed Lawrence P. Conover of Hinsdale, and John W. Leedle of West Chicago, to represent the prisoner. The judge declared himself ready to hear the case without a jury then and there if Spencer would plead guilty, but this the prisoner refused, saying that he fully understood the motive of the court, which he believed to be to sentence the prisoner to life imprisonment instead of pronouncing the death sentence upon him. He insisted upon a jury trial and a special venire was summoned for next Monday. Since then Spencer has changed his mind and has employed a lawyer, Anton Zeman, who will make every effort to win the case for Spencer. He will, it is believed, rely upon the plea of insanity and will attempt to show that Spencer came from a family tainted with insanity and had suffered a serious injury to his mind while a child.

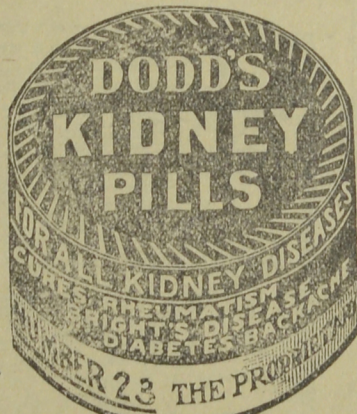

weight of the second and third stories being carried by steel beams. The interior fittings of this floor are of quartered oak and the bank fixtures of fumed oak with base of pink Tennessee marble and etched glass screens.

The main banking-room is lighted by the indirect system, the electric lights being on the ceiling in fixtures of bronze and ground glass. The floor is covered with heavy cork linoleum and the walls, as on the second floor, are of rock plaster. The ceiling and walls are ornamented with plaster cornice. The vestibule has a marble floor and ornamental plaster pilasters and cornice. All the toilets are equipped with marble floors and basins. The vault on the ground floor is of reinforced concrete and contains a large number of safety-deposit boxes. The dimensions of the vault are 8 by 14 by 10 feet. All the interior painting is in very tasteful colors.

OTHER FLOORS.

The second floor contains the head offices of Fraser, Limited, the largest lumber firm of the province. Five offices and a vault are included in this suite, any one of which can be reached from the central corridor. In the extensions on are situated the law offices of Hon. H. F. McLeod. Each suite of offices has its own toilets. The third floor is occupied by the photographic studio of C. E. McLean.
