FORECAST OF EVENTS FOR THE COMING WEEK

Washington, D. C., Nov. 1.—In the Tuesday elections Massachusetts and New Jersey will choose governors and other State officers. Maryland will express its choice for a United States senator, while New York and several other States will vote for minor officials and members of the legislature.

Congressmen will be elected to fill vacancies in the third district of Massachusetts, third district of Maryland and the thirteenth and twentieth districts of New York.

These congressional elections, together with the state elections in Massachusetts and New Jersey, are focusing national attention to a remarkable degree for an off year.

But attracting even more popular attention than the State elections is the mayoralty contest in New York

City, where a formidable opposition has united under the Fusion standard in an effort to defeat Tammany Hall.

Of much local interest and importance, also, are the municipal elections to be held in Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Buffalo, Cincinnati, Indianapolis, Louisville and a number of other cities. In nearly all of these municipal contests the reform question is a dominant issue.

Final arguments in the Government suit for the dissolution of the International Harvester Company, capitalized at \$140,000,000, will be heard in the United States circuit court at St. Paul Monday. Attorney General McReynolds will appear in person to insist that the stock of corporation, if dissolution is ordered, shall be disposed of under such stringent provisions as will make impossible a joint control of the competent companies of the corporation at any future time.

The little Republic of Panama is preparing to celebrate on Monday the tenth anniversary of its independence from Colombia and coming, as it does, soon after the turning of water into the Culabra Cut, there is likely to be a continuous round of celebrations lasting for some time.

The hearing of Harry W. Jones, secretary-treasurer of the International Association of Bridge and Structural Iron Workers, is scheduled to take place Wednesday before a United States Commissioner in Indianapolis. The charge against Jones is conspiracy to transport explosives illegally, which is the same charge on which President Ryan and 37 other officials and members of the union were convicted and sent to prison some months ago.

MISS PALMER REPLIES TO "CRUEL TEAMSTER"

To the Editor of the Mail:

DEAR SIR,—I notice the cruel teamster (as he signs himself) has asked a question and has also made two very false statements. Now I never believe in answering people who are afraid to sign their names, nevertheless, I will try an enlighten him. Also put his mind at ease about the little pony, and about going to Springhill with six in the wagon drawn by a horse with a breast-plate.

Now I did hear the name of the teamster but did not pay much attention at the time for it was the animal I was interested in and not the teamster, but I would know the name if I heard it again.

Now about the pony. That really is almost as silly to reply to. However I never took the pony out very often when it was hot. If I allowed my little girl to do so it would be either in the early morning or after supper, and then not more than an hour. The pony usually spent the hot days on my lawn getting its share of fruit and candy and anything good we had as it was treated like one of the family, and I never allowed my little girl, nine years of age, to take more than three little girls with her and more often only two. The pony got more care and attention than many children and I was more careful of it than though it had of been my own.

I am sorry the writer has been taking me for the cruel party that put seven in a pony cart and drove the poor little pony till its tongue hung out. I wish I had of seen them doing that I would have had them arrested for cruelty to animals.

Now about the Springhill drive. Well I had a hearty laugh over that. I was never to Springhill in the sixteen and a half years I have lived here with six in the wagon drawn by one horse nor even two horses and it has been at least seven years since I have had my own horse as far as Springhill, as I could not take her on the country roads on account of automobiles. The only times that I have been to Springhill in the last few years has been with a party of sometimes seven and eight and with a "good, strong horse," its name being McLaughlin-Buick, with a plate glass shield for a breast-plate with plenty of gasoline to run it and an expert driver to steer the wheel and anytime I thought he was driving the animal too fast, "I called him down too."

I might say the only time I ever remember of being in the Park with the pony on a hot day was July 4th. My little girl and I went up to the park to have a picnic. We all went in the summer-house, pony and all and it got its share of ice cream and cake.

Now the letter was most nonsensical and hard to take in for it read this way.

What teamster is responsible for the condition of the horse owned by the writer of that very touching article. It was not my horse. No one would dare ill-treat her, owing to her being a little lame. I have never allowed harness on her this summer. She has a good stall, is well fed and is cared for by the best horseman in the city.
