To produce these the workman sometimes merely touches the ball momentarily with the end of a redhot tube, thus melting the glass at the point of contact and drawing it out irregularly. In other cases ing it out irregularly. In other cases he touches one spot or another of the ball to a flame, at the same time blowing gently in the tube. The ball is pierced by two holes, one of which is caused by the breath of the workman, and the other by the hollow in the tube at the moment when this is detached from the pearl by means of a slight tap.

These balls are then merely coated inside with a preparation known as "essence of the Orient." This, despite its elaborate title, consists merely of pure water holding in solution the scales of the little fish known as the the sucking of the liquid into a tube drawn out to a fine point and then blowing it into the glass bead, which s then given a rotary motion to spread

The beads when coated are placed in a sieve whose bottom is covered with parchment and shaken incessant ly till dry. Finally they are filled with wax so as to be less fragile and a
