THE HUDSON BAY SCANDAL

Captain Robertson declares that the original reports of the terrible conditions at Port Nelson were altogether too modest. His ship arrived At Port Nelson their real troubles began with the discovery that although the different channels had been accurately charted, the Marine Department had either placed buoys wrong or not placed them at all. It was owing to this, Captain Robertson states, that the wrecked with so much loss and his 1817. own ship was almost wrecked at the same spot, while groping around for

On reaching the "port" the Alette had to anchor eight miles away, owing to shallow water, together with a small fleet of other vessels tied up for the same reason. There was only one small lighter to unload these ships, with the result that all were lying idle. Finally the Alette's deckboard and much of it lost. Eventually Captain Robertson was compelled to start back with his entire bows were smashed on the ice and had to be beached, where she and her cargo will likely be a total

As to conditions on shore at Port Nelson, Captain Robertson says that there is a condition of indescribable chaos, with all sorts of valuable material scattered around on the beach and no place to put it. Accommodation for the men was almost as bad as for the goods, there being no lumber to build shacks so that it looked as if many of the men would have to face the Arctic winter in the tents.
