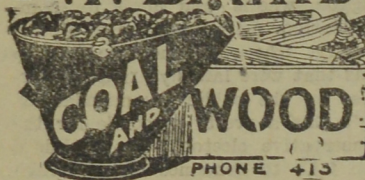

**CANADIAN CUSTOMS
PATROL LAUNCHED**

Ottawa, Ont., Dec. 11—A message received here today reports the successful launching today at the Thorneycroft yard, Southampton, of the new Customs patrol vessel Margaret intended for the Customs Patrol service in the St. Lawrence River. The boat was named after the maiden name of the Duchess of Connaught and is considered the finest steamship in Government Customs service. It is of steel and of the twin screw type, 185 feet long, and 32 feet wide, with a draught of ten and a half feet, and will carry two six-pound quick-firing guns.

**SAFETY AND
SANITATION
EXHIBITION**

New York, Dec. 11—The first Exposition of Safety and Sanitation held in conjunction with the Conference on Safety and Sanitation, under the auspices of the American Museum of Safety, was opened here today for a period of ten days at the Grand Central Palace. The government of the United States and several foreign governments are represented by interesting and instructive exhibits, showing the progress made in the methods and contrivances for insuring the safety of industrial workers, employees in the transportation service, etc., and for promoting better sanitary conditions in the various industries and occupations. The American Museum of Safety has arranged for five prizes and models to be awarded for the best safety, life-saving and health-promoting devices in every industry. The United States government exhibit includes sanitation exhibits by the Army and Navy services and an interesting safety exhibit by the Bureau of Mines.

**CHRISTMAS TREES
FOR NEW YORK**

New York, Dec. 11—The first Christmas trees from the State of Maine, mostly young spruce trees have made their appearance in the local markets and the docks near West street, where the coast schooners from Maine land their fragrant loads of holiday cheer, and loaded down with big stacks of the evergreen trees which fill the surrounding atmosphere with the balsamic odor of the pine woods. From the dock the trees are distributed all over the city to the various markets and other retailers. Maine contributes the bulk of the Christmas trees used in New York City and it is estimated that nearly \$2,000,000 are spent for these trees every year. As the cost of the trees to the wholesalers and shippers does not exceed \$160,000, there is considerable profit in the business for them as well as for the retailers.

Allied with the Christmas tree business is the trade in holly, laurel and mistletoe. These important features of Christmas season decorations come principally from Maryland, Virginia and North and South Carolina. Cape Cod also furnishes a considerable quantity of these greens for the New York and Boston markets.

**POINTS IN MR. FIELD-
ING'S SPEECH**

"The change of two years ago did not come about because the people of Canada were opposed to better trade relations with the United States. It is inconceivable that they should defeat that for which all the great statesmen of both parties had sought since Confederation.

"In the neighborhood of \$100,000,000 is in the pockets of the people of Canada today as the result of the tariff policy of the Laurier government.

"Two sessions have passed and the Conservatives have done nothing to revise the tariff which of old they sneered at. Now, according to the Conservative press they are going to wait to see how the United States tariff will work out.

"The new United States tariff means that the consumer in this country gets jug-handled reciprocity. The other country has let down the bars for our goods, but we have not made any change to get something in return.

"We are behind the times in allowing this corruption at elections to continue. Speaking in an absolutely non-partisan spirit I say that if there is one thing the great thinking men of this country should do, it is to stamp out this evil."

The result of the enormous shipments of Ontario cattle made to Buffalo following the removal of the United States tariff was seen in the market at the Union Stock Yard yesterday. Not on the North American continent was there a higher market for the the class of cattle offered than that of yesterday in Toronto.

Comparing yesterday's Toronto prices with those of Buffalo it is seen that for practically all classes of cattle prices here were higher than those for the same classes in the big market across the line. The only exception is common rough bulls, and of these there were a few cars shipped from here to Buffalo. No other kinds of cattle were shipped, or are likely to be shipped this week.

Not only the consumers, but also commission men and buyers of cattle are asking where it is going to end. All they know is that Ontario has been undergoing the process of being drained of her cattle, and where prices will go before winter is over none will venture a suggestion. Prices will be still higher, they say, for the simple reason that the cattle are not in the country.
