The Parliamentary Companion contains, the following sketch of Judge Crocket's career


Oswald Smith Crocket, B. A., of York Co., N. B., son of William Crocket, LL. D., formerly Chief Superintendent of Education of New Brunswick, Scotch, and his wife, Marian Crocket, of Scotch descent. Born April 13, 1868, at Chatham, N. B. Educated at Common schools and High School, Fredericton, and University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, (B. A. 1886). Married July 1893, to A. Birsa Stanger daughter of the late Thos. Stanger, nerchant, Fredericton. She died March 23, 1903. Married Sept. 6 1905, Clarine M. Stevenson, daughte of Chas. M. Stevenson, M. D., Coat cooke, P. Q. A Barrister. Admitte Attorney Supreme Court of N. B Oct. 15, 1891; barrister Oct. 20 1892. SPOTS ON THE SUN CAUSE TORNADOES

Sun Spots Bring Changes of Temperature's Which Often Mean Storms on the Earth

There are two general storm paths in the world—one north and the other south of the equator. The northern path starts at the equator and will be no sour food left over in the stomach to poison your breath with remains south of the 30th parallel travels northeast until it spends it self or reaches the polar regions. The same condition holds good with the southern path, except that the original direction is southeast and the change is to the southwest.

Sunspots having started air whirls from both ends of the path, the tendency of the southern whirl, being warmer, is to rise and of the northern whirl to say close to the surface. If the northern current is thick enough as it usually is in the winter time the effect of the southern current will be lost. Anything that will send th southern current higher into the air will shield the country directly in front of it from the violence of the change of atmosphere it causes. Thus a mountain range will sometimes shoot tht disturbing element so hig that while a severe storm will take place on one side of the mountain the other side is not affected at

A long stretch of flat country, ever, will permit this southern rent to settle down, if it happen be very heavy, and so get closer the earth. This explains the ter does and blizzards Manitoba and Saskatchewan.

The great lakes serve as a deflector of the currents in this country be cause of the excess of moisture in the air over these great bodies of water and the consequent heaviness the atmosphere at these points. For that reason the storms on the lake are greater and more frequent in win ter than in summer because the nor thern current, which freezes and re-moves this moisture, has the easier time. The southern current being warmer and lighter naturally passes over the lakes at a high altitude, although, of course, it sometimes cre

ates big disturbances.

There are exceptions to these conditions, of course. These are caused by purely local disturbances of the atmosphere which must be reckoned with to produce certain effects-which might change entirely the character of the effect of the battle of the upper a severe storm or no storm at all.
