WILLIAM H. LAIRD SR.

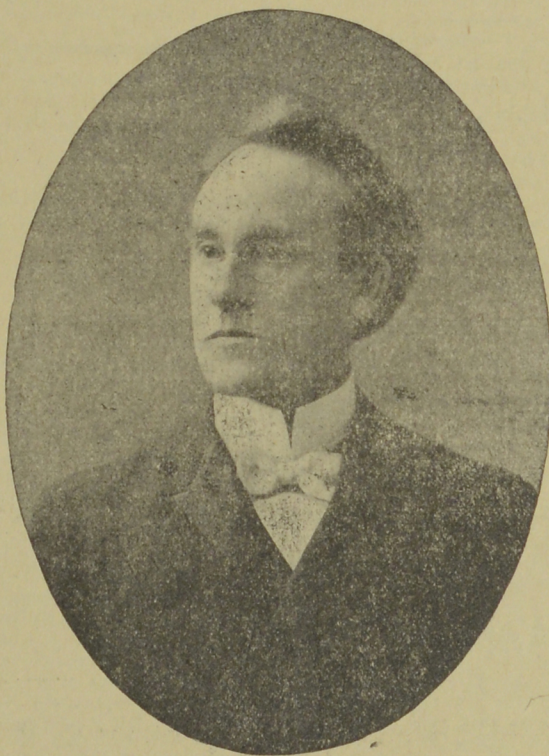

voice. He is not an echo of other people's opinions. He gives expression to profound personal convictions. He is a voice, and the voice reveals individuality. Friends often know one another by the voice even before they can be seen. There is profound significance in the statement: "There was a man sent from God whose name was John." He was indeed a noble specimen of manhood. Concerning him one might well "stand up before all the world and say, this is a man." The marked personality of John the Baptist gave special significance to his self-effacement. Not only is individuality not inconsistent with the Christian genius of life but it is wholly in harmony with the purpose of Christ. Indeed, the cultivation of the finest and strongest personality in ourselves and others is the very heart of Christian service. To attain the richest development of body, mind and heart is assuredly the worthy ambition of the follower of Christ, who should have the best we can become, if not, the Peerless Person the ideal of life, whose name we have been permitted to take and in whose service lies our highest satisfaction? The development of noble personality is a purpose which may well inspire our churches, our educational institutions, all the agencies of Christianity, and in perfect confidence that the will of the Master is being honored, every Christian may earnestly seek the fullest enrichment of life for which Providence opens the opportunity, provided only that the power for service is devotedly employed for the sake of Christ upon the "firm foundation" which the gospel provides.

And, thirdly, note that our text suggests confident co-operation. John's message is, "Make straight the way of the Lord." Level down the hills, level up the valleys; prepare a worthy road for the King. He only waits upon the preparation which His people can make. The message is not to one alone; it is addressed to many. The privilege of joining in preparation for Christ is widely extended. It is true that we must make a way for Him in our own life but it is equally and gloriously true that the co-ordinated service of Christians is essential to the consummation of our Redeemer's kingdom. "He is not willing that any should perish." His hand abides full of abundant blessings which He will pour upon His people when they are in readiness to receive and use His gifts. This is true of the individual, the church, the whole world of men. "Jesus shall" indeed, "reign where're the sun does his successive journeys run," when the servants of the Heavenly King make for Him a highway among the nations, over which He can come to reign gloriously among men. Be assured, my dear people, that Jesus Christ our Lord is eager to bless us in rich and perpetual prosperity.

Regina, Sask., Dec. 8--Issues of more than ordinary importance are involved in today's municipal elections in Alberta and Saskatchewan. Mayors and other officials are being voted for in Calgary, Saskatoon, Moose Jaw, Edmonton, Regina, Lethbridge and a number of smaller places in Calgary, Regina and Saskatoon, indications point to the re-election of the present chief executives. Lethbridge is voting for the first time under the commission plan of government. In Edmonton the chief issue is a proposal for municipal ownership of the gas plant.
